A Brief History of Miami Springs

Miami Springs was founded in 1926 by aviation pioneer Glenn Curtiss during the famous "land boom" of the 1920's on land south of the Miami Canal, an area used as a training "bombing range" for U.S. pilots during World War I, and adjacent to several airports and his flight training school. Here Curtiss developed his well-planned residential community, Country Club Estates, in a distinctive Pueblo Mission Revival style.



Since water was a crucial factor, his engineers found an inexhaustible supply of pure water under the golf course, which still supplies the Miami area. In 1930, the name was changed to Miami Springs in recognition of this. The town continued as a small, mostly residential community until after World War II. As the airline industry at Miami International Airport expanded, many employees were transferred to the area. A new "building boom" began and continued for many years. The airline industry was a major factor in the economic growth of the town, which in 1962 became the City of Miami Springs. Since that time, economic growth has remained fairly stable.

Our quiet residential oasis is home to an ethnically diverse citizenry of about 14,000, many of whom are lifetime residents.

Meet Our City Council

The City Council, composed of the Mayor and four members, is the legislative body of the City. Elected by a majority of Miami Springs voters, the City Council sets direction for the future of the City, establishes laws, regulations and policy, sets the annual millage levy and adopts the City's annual budget. To ensure continued input from the community, Council also appoints citizens to serve on 13 advisory boards.

The City Council meets regularly on the second and fourth Monday of each month, except July, and additional meetings upon call of the Mayor or three Council members. Meetings are held in the Council Chambers on the second floor of City Hall at 7 p.m. and all residents are invited to attend. Please be advised that meeting dates and times are subject to change, and you may contact the City Clerk's office if you have any questions. All proceedings are webcast live at www.miamisprings-fl.gov/webcast and archived also at that site for viewing of past meetings.

City elections are held every two years, on the first Tuesday in April

of each odd-numbered year. Any citizen who has been a resident of Miami Springs for more than six months is eligible to seek municipal elective office, and all terms of office are for two years. For information about qualifying, please contact the City Clerk's office.

Office of the City Manager (305) 805-5011

The City Manager is the Chief Administrative Officer of the City. Per City Charter, this office is responsible for implementation of the policies mandated by the City Council. The City Manager is also responsible for the direction of all City departments and functions.

Responsibilities include enforcement of all rules, regulations and policies; preparation and submission of annual operating budgets; ensuring the fiscal integrity of the City; monitoring all contracts, administrative positions, capital projects and other directives of the City Council.

Office of the City Clerk (305) 805-5006

The City Clerk officially supervises elections, offers Notary Public and Voter Registration services, maintains and preserves all permanent records, ordinances, resolutions, proclamations, minutes, contracts, historical documents and other official records, and serves as Records Management Liaison Officer to all City departments and as secretary to Mayor and Council as needed. Building and Code Compliance Department (305) 805-5030

This department is responsible for building permits, certificates of occupancy, zoning variances, building code variances and garage sale permits. Check with this department before proceeding with any type of yard sale or construction or renovation such as changing doors, replacing windows, roof repair and tree removal. Failure to get a permit can result in a fine to the homeowner and potential shoddy or dangerous work. Permit fees help defray the inspection costs and plan approvals.

Code Compliance Officers work for the protection and comfort of our community on the issuance and renewal of Occupational Licenses as well as violations. The City Code of Ordinances may be viewed online at www.municode.com/library/fl/miami_springs/codes/code_of_ordinances



Department of Elderly Services (305) 805-5160

The Senior Center, located on Prince Field at 343 Payne Drive, is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. for our “seasoned” citizens age 60 and over.

This multipurpose facility has been contributing to the quality

of life in our community for over 38 years by providing older residents with vital health, benefits and educational information; screenings and assessment services; referrals; transportation; hot congregate and home-delivered meals; nutrition, safety, financial and consumer education; and numerous opportunities to participate in exercise classes, as well as recreational, social, health and wellness activities, free income tax preparation and many other types of programs. There is a free lending library available of books, games and puzzles, and a computer lab for free access to the internet. Mini-bus transportation to and from the Center is provided if needed, as well as assistance with grocery shopping, trips to malls and other places of interest to help our seniors maintain their independence. Finance Department (305) 805-5020



The Finance Department oversees all City financial operations including accounts payable and receivable, audits, budget, capital projects, cash management, public services billings, accounting, debt administration, fixed asset reporting, financial reporting and accounting, payroll for City employees, and revenue forecasting and monitoring.

Additionally, the Finance Department is responsible for purchasing services including the official City bidding process, grants, public information and professional services.

Human Resources Department (305) 805-5008

The Human Resources Department (HR) provides an overall policy direction on citywide human resource management issues and administrative support functions for all City departments. The department is responsible for labor and employee relations, classification and compensation, recruitment and selection, testing and validation, EEO compliance, employee records, organizational development, benefits administration and strategic planning. The HR Department also manages the City's insurance contracts and risk management claims.

Planning and Zoning Department (305) 805-5034

The City Planner reviews and submits recommendations on all land development and use proposals and serves as the City liaison to state, regional and county agencies regarding land use planning for the City.

All questions and proposals regarding the Comprehensive Land Use Plan, any type of residential or commercial development or property changes and all variances from our Building and Zoning Code prior to hearing by the Board of Adjustment go through this office.

The City Planner also works with commercial and multi-family development on the site plan review process to assure that issues such as drainage, landscaping, lighting and parking meet City Code. Additionally, the City Planner provides coordination for and management of special projects as directed by the City Manager.



Miami Springs Golf and Country Club (305) 805-5180



Miami Springs is a town that was built around a golf course, and to this day it retains and maintains this facility as a tribute to our past. The course is a challenging 18 hole Par 72, and also has a newly turfed and upgraded driving range. Its 216 historic acres provide a sweeping vista of tropical foliage and serenity at the entrance to our City, a sense of heritage and pride to our residents, and an opportunity to walk in the footsteps of legends for the thousands of golfers who play there every year. In addition to a large following of recreational golfers, there are special Senior and Junior opportunities and clinics for beginner and seasoned golfers scheduled every week throughout the year.



Built in 1923 by Glenn Curtiss, it is the oldest municipal golf course in South Florida, and the first golf course in Florida (and maybe in the South) to admit African-Americans. Abundant fresh water discovered under it gave our City its name, and the original wooden aqueducts still exist under the greens.

Its history reads like a Who's-Who of the most famous individuals of their time, including: Walter Hagen, Tommy Armour, Gene Sarazen, Byron Nelson, Sam Snead, Mickey Mantle, Yogi Berra, Don Drysdale, Whitey Ford, Jackie Robinson, Althea Gibson, Charlie Sifford, Dinah Washington, Nat "King" Cole, Sugar Ray Robinson, Joe Louis and Arnold Palmer. The Miami Springs Golf Course was the home of the PGA Miami Open from 1925 to 1955. If you, too, would like to walk in the footsteps of legends, call us for a tee time!

And for our non-golfers.... A wide variety of services and menus are offered, from a quick lunch to a formal banquet. Many local civic organizations and clubs hold their meetings and functions here.

Miami Springs Police Department

Located on the Park Street side of City Hall, our Police Department protects the lives and property of our residents, businesses and visitors. The department preserves the peace, prevents crime, detects and arrests offenders, regulates and controls traffic, and enforces all federal, state, county and local rules, regulations, laws and ordinances.

Through the General and Law Enforcement Trust Funds, the department also operates the Community Policing Office, the School Crossing Guard Program, and other public safety and special law enforcement efforts of the Departments of Justice, Homeland Security and other agencies.

Community Policing Office (305) 888-5286



To bring the police closer to our residents on a more proactive and personal level, the Community Policing Office is located at 274 Westward Drive. CPO staff and officers are specially trained to work with residents, school children and senior citizens to ensure that Miami Springs remains a place where all can live and work safely.

They also provide drug abuse prevention programs and disseminate public safety information. They oversee the Neighborhood and Business Crime Watch programs that work with concerned citizens to teach awareness of potential criminal activity in their vicinity. Public Works Department (305) 805-5170

Our Public Works Department, located at 345 North Royal Poinciana Boulevard, has multiple responsibilities that include:

- **Refuse Collection and Disposal** - Garbage is collected twice weekly and trash is collected weekly. Every home is provided with a 90-gallon container for garbage, trash, leaves, clippings and other lightweight debris. Special requests must be made for removal of large items such as furniture or appliances, and an extra fee may be charged. 65-gallon recycling carts are also provided, and are picked up curbside biweekly by the County. Call Public Works for answers to questions about scheduling and costs, if any. **Please note that Public Works does not assist with the removal of building materials or construction debris**, which must be brought to a Miami-Dade County Solid Waste Management landfill (305) 258-2830. Call 311 for information for disposal of hazardous waste like computer parts, batteries, or oil that cannot go in the landfill.
- **Maintenance of Public Buildings and Grounds, including Tree Trimming** - Miami Springs enjoys a wonderful tree canopy and has earned the designation as a **Tree City USA** for more than two decades. Help us reduce our carbon footprint! Before you remove any trees from your property, check with the City Arborist at the above number. Some species are protected by City and County Codes, and carry stiff fines for improper trimming or removal. Also, a permit is required for the removal of certain trees.
- **Streets, Street Lights, Service Alley, Bike Path and Sidewalk Maintenance**
- **Stormwater Management** - Drainage

Recreation Department (305) 805-5075



The City of Miami Springs Recreation Department provides a wide range of recreational opportunities for residents and visitors of all ages in our state-of-the-art Community and Aquatic Center complexes. These include After-School, Summer and School Holiday supervised programs for children in grades 1 through 8, organized seasonal sports programs for children and adults, swimming lessons and cardio water exercise classes, jazzercise, community theater, an indoor jogging track, a walking club and a fitness center. Special events such as the 4th of July Parade, Christmas at the Gazebo, the Annual Daddy-Daughter Dance, and a “spooktacular” Halloween event also originate from this Department.



The Tot Lots on Prince Field and in Stafford Park are specially equipped for our littlest residents, and other recreational green spaces are located throughout the City for pick-up sports, jogging and cycling. Pavilions at Prince Field and Stafford Park and cabanas and the multi-purpose room at the Aquatic Center are available for private event rental. Resident canines will enjoy romping with their owners at the Dog Park on Dove Avenue, opposite Miami Springs Senior High School. The Tennis Center at 401 Westward Drive offers lessons, tournaments and open play for all ages. Besides recreational activities, the Community Center also functions as a voting location and hosts monthly visits from the Florida Motor Vehicles Department.

City Boards and Commissions

- **Architectural Review Board:** Makes recommendations on plans, specifications and designs for commercial properties.
- **Board of Adjustment / Zoning and Planning Board:** Deals with zoning issues and the granting of variances.
- **Charter Review Board:** Reviews the Charter and issues recommendations for amendments.
- **Civil Service Board:** Deals with issues regarding our employees.
- **Code Enforcement Board:** A quasi-judicial board that hears cases regarding City Code violations. Appeals to Board decisions are to the Circuit Court.
- **Code Review Board:** Researches new or existing codes and recommends changes at the direction of the City Council.
- **Disability Advisory Board:** Assists the City in prioritizing projects that will improve universal accessibility in public places.
- **Ecology Board:** Makes recommendations regarding pollution and other issues impacting our environment.
- **Education Advisory Board:** Assists the Council in formulating policies relating to the public schools in our area.
- **Fire and Police Retirement Board:** Provides for the pension plan for officers.
- **Golf and Country Club Advisory Board:** Acts in an advisory capacity in all matters relating to that facility to the City Council.
- **General Employees Retirement Board:** Provides for the pension and payment of other benefits upon the retirement of employees.
- **Historic Preservation Board:** Identifies and preserves structures of historic significance.
- **Board of Parks and Parkways:** Assists with planning the beautification of our public areas and our tree canopy.
- **Recreation Commission:** Acts as an advisory committee for the City Council in recreational matters.



The Free-Bee Shuttle



The Springs Free-Bee Shuttle is a service funded by the Miami-Dade County People's Transportation Plan. The City provides this free community bus service in order to increase the number of destinations that can be reached by public transit. The Miami Springs Free-Bee has designated bus stops, and will also pick up passengers who hail it along the route. Please fold strollers and carts before boarding. The Free-Bee has bicycle racks and is wheelchair accessible. Hours of operation are Monday through Friday from 7a.m. to 6 p.m. There is no service on weekends or City-observed holidays.
