| <b>Wednesday<br/>01/01/2014<br/>1443 hrs</b> | Unknown subject(s) entered a vehicle parked at the La Quinta Inn (3501 NW 42 Ave) by unknown means and removed a digital camera, sunglasses and two hats; all items were valued at \$1,320.00.  |
| <b>Wednesday<br/>01/01/2014<br/>1512 hrs</b> | A vehicle parked in the 600 block of Minola Drive was discovered to have a shattered rear window. A rifle round projectile was discovered inside the van and no casing was found nearby. Based on the damage, it is believed that the rifle round may have come from the direction of Southeast Hialeah, perhaps during the New Year's Eve celebrations.  |

| <b>Saturday<br/>01/04/2014<br/>2347 hrs</b>  | <p>A witness observed two subjects throwing rocks at a vehicle parked at the Sleep Inn (105 Fairway Dr). The subjects fled the area on foot. Officers discovered that the vehicle had sustained \$300.00 in damage to the roof and window, but no entry had been made. Officers also discovered another vehicle in the parking lot that had a broken window.
