Day/Date	Activity
Tuesday 01/28/2014 0845 hrs	Unknown subject(s) entered the victim's unlocked vehicle parked in the 800 block of Bluebird Ave. The vehicle and trunk were ransacked and it is unknown at this time what items may have been taken.
Thursday 01/30/2014 2037 hrs	An unknown male subject robbed a woman at gunpoint of her wallet and \$500.00 in cash from a hotel room at the La Quinta Inn & Suites (3501 NW 42 Ave). The investigation revealed that the victim had invited the subject to her room as a result of her escort service business and was robbed by the subject shortly after he arrived.
Friday 01/31/2014 1050 hrs	Unknown subject(s) pried open the rear glass doors of a residence in the 500 block of Huntinglodge Drive. Two bedrooms were ransacked; it is unknown what items were taken at this time.
Friday 01/31/2014 1449 hrs	Two subjects attempted to deposit a check in the amount of \$1,525.00 and a refund slip requesting \$1,250.00 in return. The teller contacted police due to the suspicion that the check and refund slip were written in the same handwriting, but supposedly from two different people. Officers detained the subjects before they could leave the area. The investigation revealed that the subjects had possession of several stolen driver's licenses, debit cards and checks and were attempting to fraudulently cash the stolen check. Both subjects were charged with identity theft, Depositing check with intent to defraud and grand theft.
Saturday 02/01/2014 1155 hrs	Unknown subject(s) pried open the drivers door lock of a vehicle parked at the IHOP (5175 NW 36 St). A vinyl bag containing a passport, laptop, camera and GPS valued at \$735.00 was stolen.
Sunday 02/02/2014 1100 hrs	A subject was seen breaking into a vehicle parked at the Airport Café (4427 NW 36 St). The subject was seen crouching next to the victim's rental van and when the victim went outside to investigate, the subject got in his vehicle and fled. It was discovered that the driver's door had been pried open and a Coach purse containing miscellaneous identification and credit cards was stolen. Total value of items stolen was \$1,902.00.
