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A special meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Miami Springs was held in the Municipal Building on December 8, 1954, at 10:00 A. M. Those present were:

Councilman Herrell explained that the selection of a mayor is the responsibility of the Town Council and that he would be guided entirely by the Council's wishes in the matter. Councilman Allen expressed surprise at the situation, and stated that at the previous election in 1952, he had been the candidate receiving the fourth highest number of votes and that when a vacancy occurred on the Council he felt that he should have been appointed to fill that vacancy, but the Council had selected someone else for the job. Councilman Allen further stated that in this election the people of Miami Springs had indicated that they wanted him on the Council, and, because he had received the highest number of votes cast for any candidate, he felt that the Council should select him for the position of mayor. Councilman Herrell stated that there were no personalities involved, but that he did not feel that any person without previous experience on the Council was qualified to act as mayor and that he personally would never vote to elect anyone mayor who had not previously served at least two years as a member of the Council. Councilman Allen stated that he would have to vote "No" on the motion, and the Chairman assured him that his vote would be so recorded. No further comment being made, Councilman Herrell called for a vote and Councilmen Parrish, Plassey and Gall voted for the motion, Councilman Herrell abstained from voting and Councilman Allen voted "No", and the motion was passed.

Councilman Parrish moved that Councilman Allen assume the duties formerly held by Councilman Schulz as coordinator of Zoning and Planning matters. The motion was seconded by Councilman Plassey and on being put to vote the motion was carried.
