



Mayor Herrell announced that the next order of business would be the selection by the Council of the Town Mayor. The Council unanimously agreed that pending the selection of mayor, Councilman Herrell would act as temporary Chairman of the meeting. Councilman Parrish stated that because in his opinion Mr. Herrell had done an outstanding job for the Town while serving as itsmayor, and because of his experience in handling the duties of the office, he felt that Councilman W. C. Herrell should be reappointed as Mayor. Councilman Parrish then moved that W. C. Herrell be named as Mayor for the Town of Miami Springs and the motion was seconded by Councilman Plassey. Several members of the audience expressed disapproval of the motion and indicated their belief that Candidate Allen should have been chosen for the position. Councilman Allen further stated that in this election the people of Miami Springs had indicated that they wanted him on the Council, and, because he had received the highest number of votes cast for any candidate, he felt that the Council should select him for the position of mayor. Councilman Herrell stated that there were no personalities involved, but that he did not feel that any person without previous experience on the Council was qualified to act as mayor and that he personally would never vote to elect anyone mayor who had not previously served at least two years as a member of the Council. Councilman Allen stated that he would have to vote "No" on the motion, and the Chairman assured him that his vote would be so recorded. No further comment being made, Councilman Herrell called for a vote and Councilmen Parrish, Plassey and Gall voted for the motion, Councilman Herrell abstained from voting and Councilman Allen voted "No", and the motion was passed.

Councilman Parrish moved that Councilman Allen assume the duties formerly held by Councilman Schulz as coordinator of Zoning and Planning matters. The motion was seconded by Councilman Plassey and on being put to yote the motion was carried.
