

Happy 2024 To Our Miami Springs Community!

As we start another year we have so much to be proud of in our beautiful City. I wanted to share some of what we have accomplished together as a community in 2023 and some of the plans for 2024. In addition to increasing public safety and investing in expanding our programming and services to meet the needs of our residents and businesses, we:

- Maintained our residents' millage rate steady (no increase), despite this year's challenges of unprecedented inflation, rising insurance, labor and other costs
- Secured significant State appropriation dollars for our Senior Center Meals and new War Memorial, thanks to the support of our Senator Bryan Avila and Representative Alex Rizo
- Created a Committee to plan for the City's 2026 Centennial Celebration.
- Invested in necessary (30-year intervals) re-sodding of the golf course to ensure our City's top-notch golf course status
- Completed the South Royal Poinciana Improvement Project
- Completed the bid and selected the contractor for the East
 Drive/Oakwood Avenue Project stormwater improvement projects
- Received the Business and Economic Development Task Force report and held a townhall meeting to discuss recommendations
- Held several public workshops including ones for the City's budget and Strategic Plan

- Continued to improve and expand communications with our community via the City's newsletters, social media, surveys, website and emergency alert system
- Increased awareness of City Council decisions by posting "Actions Taken Summary" of meetings
- Initiated collaborations with Miami Springs hotel owners/managers to foster a joint vision for opportunities and success
- Secured a grant for a parking study for our Central Business District and will be holding a workshop in 2024
- Instructed our Parks Advisory Board to work on update of City's tree ordinance to better protect and expand our valued tree canopy
- Increased the City's recreation opportunities with the addition of pickleball
- Saw impressive progress of new construction project in our southeast business district for the Miami Realtors Association Global Headquarters
- Heard FDOT presentations on three proposed projects and we will continue discussions with them to ensure the planned projects are successful for both FDOT and our City
- Hired the firm of Calvin, Giordano and Associates as our city planners and we are working with them to improve the economic vitality of our business districts
- This was an election year for our City and we bid farewell to Councilman Bob Best who was termed out, and welcomed Councilman Jorge Santin and Councilman Victor Vazquez
- We also voted on a charter amendment to provide for uninterrupted Council representation should a Councilmember not be able to fulfill their term
- We welcomed Chris Chiocca as our Finance Director
- We congratulated former City Manager William Alonso on his retirement
- We welcomed our new City Manager JC Jimenez and share his commitment to excellence to serve the community
