RESOLUTION HP 1-2012

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI SPRINGS HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOARD ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE DESIGNATION REPORT FOR THE H. O. GOODLETT HOUSE; DESIGNATING THE SUBJECT PROPERTY AS A LOCAL HISTORIC SITE; SPECIFYING THE AUTHORIZATION AND REQUIREMENTS OF DESIGNATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, at the meeting of September 20, 2012, the City of Miami Springs Historic Preservation Board unanimously approved a motion to start the designation process for the H. O. Goodlett House located at 141 Shadow Way, which is legally described as:

LOTS 4 AND 5, BLOCK 21, AMENDED PLAT, OF SECTION ONE OF "COUNTRY CLUB ESTATES" ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF, AS RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 28, PAGE 11 OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA.

AND:

THE SOUTH 50.00 FEET OF TRACT "B", BLOCK 21, REVISED PLAT OF PORTION OF AMENDED PLAT OF SECTION ONE OF "COUNTRY CLUB ESTATES", ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF, AS RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 34, PAGE 39 OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA.

WHEREAS, the H. O. Goodlett House, a Pueblo style single family residence, was constructed in 1925 by B. L. Smith as a two-bedroom, one-bath structure with an attached portecochere; and,

WHEREAS, the H. O. Goodlett House was once owned by Mrs. Lena Curtiss Wheeler and several pioneer residents lived there, including Hugh Frank who was the first City employee; and,

WHEREAS, Hiram Owen Goodlett and his wife Helen Mary Anders rented the house in 1934, together with their daughter Mary Ann and son Robert, and the home was purchased by the Goodlett family in 1946; and,

WHEREAS, the H. O. Goodlett House is an example of small homes that were built during the 1920's "land boom" to attract workers and retirees to the area; and,

WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Board has determined that the house is significant in the areas of history and architecture; and,

WHEREAS, the subject property of the designation is located within the boundaries and jurisdiction of the City of Miami Springs, Florida; and,

WHEREAS, following appropriate review of the designation documentation at a properly noticed public hearing, the City of Miami Springs Historic Preservation Board has determined that the designation of the H. O. Goodlett House is both proper and appropriate,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MIAMI SPRINGS HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOARD:

<u>Section 1:</u> That the designation report submitted on the H. O. Goodlett House is hereby accepted and approved as submitted, following a public hearing on the same which was held on Thursday, October 18, 2012.

Section 2: That the H. O. Goodlett House located at 141 Shadow Way, Miami Springs, Florida, which is legally described below, is hereby designated as a local historic site;

LOTS 4 AND 5, BLOCK 21, AMENDED PLAT, OF SECTION ONE OF "COUNTRY CLUB ESTATES" ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF, AS RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 28, PAGE 11 OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA.

AND:

THE SOUTH 50.00 FEET OF TRACT "B", BLOCK 21, REVISED PLAT OF PORTION OF AMENDED PLAT OF SECTION ONE OF "COUNTRY CLUB ESTATES", ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF, AS RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 34, PAGE 39 OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA.

<u>Section 3:</u> That the aforesaid designation of the H. O. Goodlett House is authorized by the provisions contained within Chapter 153 of the City of Miami Springs Code of Ordinances, which further subjects the designated property to all rights, privileges and requirements contained therein.

<u>Section 4:</u> That this resolution and the designation contained herein, shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

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

On February 6, 2015 at 1707 hours, Officer Matthew Castillo conducted a traffic stop at the 4400 block of NW 36 St. He noticed the occupants were nervous and smelled a strong odor of marijuana in the vehicle. His investigation and search of the vehicle led to the arrest of a passenger for felony narcotics distribution charges. In total he recovered approximately 280 grams of marijuana in the vehicle. The following day on February 7th, 2015, while actively patrolling the community, he conducted a traffic stop at the 400 block of Swan Avenue on a vehicle that matched a B.O.L.O. for grand theft suspects. His investigation led to the arrests of two females for grand theft charges for a series of different local yard sales thefts that occurred since at least December 13th, 2014. Both subjects admitted the thefts and said some of the jewelry and other stolen property was at both of their residences. Sadly enough, there were even reports by residents that the subjects had used children in the pasts as distractions during the thefts. I witnessed as Ofc. M. Castillo promised several angry residents the day before that he would catch these yard sale thieves soon. He stayed true to his word.

On February 10th, 2015, Ofc. M. Castillo was a backup unit for Ofc. R. Castillo who had conducted a traffic stop in the 4300 block of NW 36 St. Ofc. M. Castillo assisted Ofc. R. Castillo during the stop which led to a felony and misdemeanor narcotics arrest. However, Ofc. M. Castillo took it a step further and discovered by talking to the driver that he was a confidential informant for the City of Miami Police. He confirmed this by speaking to a Miami Police Homicide Detective who confirmed him as a confidential informant who was credible. This confidential informant then gave information that the gang he was connected to sent him to the Miami Springs area. He was told by his affiliates to stay at the Days Inn Hotel (4767 NW 36 St) to check out the area for possible future robberies. The confidential informant advised he was willing to cooperate with MSPD and give further information to Miami Springs Detectives.

On February 19, 2015, while conducting an area check of businesses in the area of NW 34 St / 42 Av, he observed a suspicious vehicle. His investigation revealed the vehicle was stolen out of the City of Miami on 02/11/15. The vehicle was recovered and later returned to the owner, who was very thankful.

I would like to take this moment to nominate Ofc. M. Castillo for the February Officer of the Month Award. He made several great felony arrests and other self initiated actions that should be commended. He did this while only having worked three weeks this month (had a vacation week). Furthermore, he took an extra step during an investigation and was able to obtain information that more than likely prevented several robberies in our beloved community. Lastly, I would like to point to the fact that for 2015 he has made the most felony arrests so far in the whole department and is second in total arrests made.

3. Awards & Presentations:

A) Presentation by Miami-Dade County Fire Rescue Department Regarding the Department's Accomplishments and Services to the City of Miami Springs

Miami-Dade County Fire Chief Dave Downey presented the annual report for 2014 and a review of the services that were provided to the City by Miami-Dade County Fire Rescue. He reported that Station No. 35 responded to 86% of the calls; there are seven fire stations within five miles of the City with more than 46 firefighters on duty every day and the response time within the City is 5 minutes, 50 seconds.

5. Approval of Council Minutes:

The City Attorney stated that the next time the City does a comprehensive charter review, consideration should be given to changing the provision in Section 8.01 (1) because the City Attorney and City Clerk serve at the will of Council and their vote of confidence is one month before an election. He suggested making a list of Charter provisions that are inconsistent and when there are four or five items on the list it would be beneficial to place the questions on the ballot during a regular election.

B) City Manager

City Manager Gorland reminded everyone of the upcoming events, including the Farmers Market and the Recreation sponsored Health-Fit event on Saturday, March 14th.

C) City Council

Councilman Windrem announced that he will be playing his guitar at the Farmers Market on Saturday.

Councilman Lob wished everyone a good night.

Councilman Bain thanked Chief of Police Guzman and his Staff for accommodating the partial closure of the Circle during the weekend event and said that they did a great job. He appreciates what they did under the circumstances. He wished everyone a good evening.

Mayor Garcia announced that the "Springs Connection" is being mailed out to all the residents. He encouraged everyone to support the local Farmers Market every Saturday for the next four or five weeks. He reported that County Commissioner Rebeca Sosa is sponsoring a Movie Night in the City of Miami Springs featuring the "The Lego Movie" and food trucks will be there; there is also a fundraiser for the Geiger Memorial that same night.

ORDINANCE NO. – 2015

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI SPRINGS CREATING CODE OF ORDINANCE SECTION 97-06; LONG TERM RESIDENT SENIOR CITIZEN TAX EXEMPTION; BY ESTABLISHING AN ADDITIONAL HOMESTEAD TAX EXEMPTION AVAILABLE TO QUALIFYING SENIOR CITIZENS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; DIRECTIONS TO CODIFIERS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, on November 3, 1998, voters of the State of Florida approved an amendment to the Florida Constitution providing for an additional amount of Homestead Exemption for qualified senior citizens; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the enactment of H.B. 291, now codified as Florida Statute Section 196.075, all County and Municipal governments were required to enact enabling ordinances in order for the additional Homestead Tax Exemption to be applicable within their respective jurisdictions for qualified persons 65 years of age or older; and,

WHEREAS, due to the potential financial impact of the additional Homestead Exemption on local government finances, many jurisdictions, including the City of Miami Springs, determined that such enabling legislation was not to be enacted at that time; and,

WHEREAS, although the financial impact of enacting such legislation on local government finances remained constant, the City Council remained cognizant of the impact of the rising costs of living on older citizens who subsist on fixed incomes, and enacted Code Section 97-05 in October of 2005 to authorize seniors to apply for the additional \$25,000 Homestead Tax Exemption; and,

WHEREAS, in the recent Presidential Election of 2012, the voters of Florida approved proposed Constitutional Amendment No. 11 which authorized the amendment of Florida Statute Section 196.075 to allow local government authorization of two (2) different additional Homestead Tax Exemptions for seniors; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the recently adopted Constitutional Amendment, Florida Statute Section 196.075 now authorizes local governments to adopt ordinances to allow either or both of the following additional Homestead Tax Exemptions, to wit:

- An exemption not exceeding Fifty Thousand (\$50,000)
 Dollars to any person who has the legal or equitable title
 to real estate, maintains their permanent residence on
 the property, is 65 or older, and whose household
 income does not exceed the income limitation:
- An additional exemption equal to the assessed value of the property to an owner who has title to real estate in Florida with a just value less than Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$250,000) Dollars, has maintained permanent residence on the property for not less than 25 years, is 65 or older and whose household income does not exceed the income limitation:

WHEREAS, in December of 2012, the City Council amended code of Ordinance Section 97-05 to increase the low income senior citizen homestead exemption amount from \$25,000 to \$50,000; and,

WHEREAS, at that time, the City Council, postponed the enactment of the second authorized homestead exemption for long term senior residents; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is now proper and appropriate, and in the best interests of its City's long term senior residents, to authorize the second homestead exemption provision provided in Florida Statute Section 196.075 (2)(b).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI SPRINGS, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That Code of Ordinance Section 97-06, Long Term Resident Senior Citizen Tax Exemption, is hereby created as follows:

<u>Section 97-06 – Long Term Resident Senior Citizen Tax Exemption</u>

- (A) Long Term Resident Exemption. In accordance with Section 6 (d), Article VII, of the Florida Constitution and the provisions of Florida Statute Section 196.075, an additional exemption in the amount of the assessed value of any homestead real property may be requested by any person who has the legal or equitable title to such real property, so long as the homestead property has a just value of the less than \$250,000, the property owner has maintained a permanent residence thereon for at least 25 years, the owner has attained the age of 65, and has a household income that does not exceed the amount initially prescribed in Florida Statute Section 196.075(2)(a) that has been adjusted annually since enactment in accordance with the provisions of Florida Statutes Section 196.075(3).
- (B) Adoption of Provisions. The filing requirements, waiver of exemption, annual household income adjustment and notification to Property Appraiser provisions set forth in Code of Ordinance Sections 97-05(B)(C)(E)(F) are hereby adopted by this reference herein, and are hereby made applicable to the Long Term Resident Exemption provision set for in Subsection (A) of this ordinance.
- (C) Applicable time of exemption. This Long Term Resident Exemption shall be available for request an application for the 2016 real property tax year. All eligible property owners are directed to contact the Office of the Miami-Dade County Tax Appraiser to request the proper instructions and documents for securing the additional exemption.

Section 2: That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed insofar as they are in conflict.

<u>Section 3:</u> That the codifiers are hereby directed to codify this Ordinance in accordance with their discretion and their prior codification of the City of Miami Springs Code of Ordinances.

Section 4: That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

Recommendation by Public Works that Council authorize the issuance of a Purchase Order to Jobbers Equipment Warehouse, utilizing Miami Dade County contract #0924-3/09-3, in the amount of \$27,620.54, for a heavy duty drive on vehicle lift, pursuant to Section §31.11 (E)(5) of the City Code.

DISCUSSION: An inspection performed on March 9, 2015 found the current vehicle lift has structural and integrity failures and mechanical problems. The cost of repairing the current equipment is half the cost of replacement, due to the age and history of the lift, and it wasn't recommended. Even though we are using M-D contract, we contacted 2 other vendors for quotes. Jobbers Equipment came in the lowest. The quote from Equipment City does not include freight or the installation of the lift.

FISCAL IMPACT: The money for the lift is coming from the \$40,000 contingency fund put aside at budget.





In accordance with your recent correspondence to the City of Miami Springs of March 12 and March 11, 2015 respectively, the City of Miami Springs wishes to advise that it will gratefully accept the League's offer to authorize the Johnson/Anselmo Firm to represent the City in the above captioned matter.

In addition, the City will be authorizing the law firm of Weiss, Serota, Helfman, et. al. to represent the City's interests on all claims that the League has determined to be excluded from the City's insurance coverage. It is our understanding that the costs of such representation will be covered by American Traffic Solutions, Inc.

Please be sure to contact Edward Guedes, Esq. at Weiss, Sorota, Helfman, et. al. to coordinate the joint defense of the City in this litigation.

As requested, we have enclosed a copy of the City's executed contract with American Traffic Solutions, Inc., along with a copy of the City's most current Business Rules Questionnaire (BRQ) which sets forth the operating processes for the issuance of Notices of Violation (NOV) for Uniform Traffic Citations (UTC) by the City.

By way of further clarification, prior to February 2015 police officers only were required to review potential violations at the time of issuance of Notices of Violation. Further, at this time, the City has neither received official Service of Process, nor executed a Waiver of Service on behalf of the City in the pending litigation.
