A) Presentation by School Board Member Christi Fraga seeking support from the City to require that notice be provided to the School Board and the superintendent of schools of Planned developments that may impact public schools

Schoolboard Member Christie Fraga provided an oral presentation on several items that will be part of the School Board's legislative docket at the State level. She seeks support from all City's for the School Board's 2021 initiative. School Board Member Fraga also requested the City's support on notification of developments that occur within a certain distance from public schools.

City Council conceded to bring forward resolutions supporting the School Board and School Board Member Fraga's initiatives.

Councilman Best moved to approve the Ordinance on second reading. Councilman Fajet seconded the motion, which carried 4-1 on roll call vote. The vote was as follows: Vice Mayor Garcia, Councilman Best, Councilwoman Mitchell and Councilman Fajet voting Yes; Mayor Bain voting No.

Councilman Best thanked School Board Member Fraga for her presentation this evening. He stated that he went before the City Council of Virginia Gardens and is set up to be before the Council of Medley to get their support for the improvements for the memorial. A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI SPRINGS, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL BOARD'S 2021 STATE LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR TRANSMITTAL; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Miami Springs (the "City") is committed to improving education for its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade County Public Schools ("MDCPS") School Board (the "Board") has approved a 2021 State Legislative Program, encouraging the Florida legislature to fund several key measures related to public schools in the District; and

WHEREAS, the Board's 2021 State Legislative Program addresses key measures such as increasing the Base Student Allocation (BSA); implementing a revised District Cost Differential (DCD) ensuring that the DCD takes into account cost differences integral to educational institutions' operations; extending the authorization of the locally-voted levy for operating purposes; funding select student programs beyond the 1.0 Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) cap or 25 hours a week, and amending the Marjory Stoneman Douglas Safety Act and others as described in Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that this Resolution is in the best interest and welfare of the residents of the City to support the Board's 2021 State Legislative Program attached hereto as Exhibit "A."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI SPRINGS, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Recitals.</u> The above recitals are confirmed, adopted, and incorporated herein and made a part hereof by reference.

Section 2. Approval. The City Council hereby expresses its support of the Board's 2021 State Legislative Program attached hereto as Exhibit "A."

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS 2021 STATE LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM

MISSION/GOAL STATEMENT

The Florida Legislature should establish a five-year strategic plan to restore, stabilize, and increase funding through the Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP) to achieve at least the national average in per pupil expenditures to provide the highest quality education and to enable all of our students to be empowered to lead productive and fulfilling lives as lifelong learners and responsible citizens.

2021 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

FUNDING:

Protect school district operational funding by mitigating any FTE enrollment declines experienced by districts and any impact of state budget shortfalls by fully funding districts based on the 2019-2020 fourth FTE calculation and minimally providing per student funding at 2020-2021 levels or \$7,793.01 (statewide), and for Miami-Dade \$7,941.46.*

Implement the following strategies to avoid or mitigate education shortfalls:

- Avoid rolling back the Required Local Effort (estimated \$332.8 million):
- Identify new funding source(s) such as the Seminole Tribe gaming or fees;
- Provide flexibility in the use of all funds;
- Provide maximize flexibility with all federal stimulus monies;
- Implement a moratorium on new programs;
- Redirect the Schools of Hope funding to the BSA (\$40 million);
- Provide flexibility in Class Size Reduction to account for the possibility of classroom teacher and staff shortages due to the corona virus;
- Use Working Capital Trust Fund to avoid reductions to K-12 education; and
- Do not expand scholarship programs for 2020-2021.

Continue the Funding Compression and Hold Harmless Allocation formula established during the 2020 legislative session to address inequities of the current District Cost Differential calculation.*

Extend the authorization of the locally voted levy for operating purposes from four years to 10 years.

Expand the allowable use of the Teacher Classroom Supply Assistance Program to include classroom equipment and personal protective equipment.

Support funding to offer an extended school day and year beyond 180 days for all students to address learning loss as a result of required school closures due to COVID-19.*

ACCOUNTABILITY AND ASSESSMENT REFORM:

For 2020-2021, waive the sanctions related to third grade promotion, end-of-course calculations, graduation test requirements, performance evaluations of school- site instructional and administrative staff, or reinstate the No more Than One Letter Grade Drop provision established in 2012.*

Require all publicly funded educational delivery methods to adhere to the same regulatory and funding standards.

*Denotes priority item



GOVERNANCE:

Support constitutionally elected local school boards and elected or appointed superintendents' authority to supervise all public schools.

CAPITAL FUNDING:

Support the state fully funding charter school capital outlay and ensure that sharing school board's Local Discretionary Capital Outlay levy revenue with charter schools is permissible and not required for school districts.

SCHOOL SECURITY

Fully fund the cost of the requirement of a School Resource Officer (SRO) or School Safety Officer (SSO) at each public school.

Increase funding significantly for mental health services for students to facilitate the hiring additional school counselors, social workers, and psychologists.

Continue to provide funding for safety infrastructure needs inclusive of mobile panic alert system and cameras in school buses and on bus stop-arms.

TEACHER/PERSONNEL SHORTAGE:

Continue to invest in teacher salaries by continuing to fund the Teacher Salary Increase Allocation as a separate categorical as well as implement and fund strategies such as teacher fellowships and loan forgiveness programs to encourage and attract talented students to enter the field of education.*

Allow school districts to re-employ teachers, other instructional personnel, and substitute teachers after one month of retirement without penalty to the employee's pension.

Ensure that Pre-K teachers are included in all funding opportunities and benefits afforded to K-12 teachers such as the extension of the Deferred Retirement Option Program to 96 months.*

Amend F.S. 1012.22 to stipulate that performance-based salary adjustments are annual and not recurring.

Extend the deadline for the completion of the requirements for the obtainment of Professional and Temporary Teaching Certificates through June 30, 2021.

SCHOOL READINESS:

Support state funding for a high-quality, full-day Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK) program that provides a minimum of 990 hours for all eligible students.

Replace the current VPK assessment with a developmentally appropriate on-going assessment tool to timely measure children's progress and development, to inform the teachers and parents, and to evaluate the program's effectiveness.



ADDITIONAL ISSUES

FUNDING

Fund programs taken by students beyond the 1.0 FTE cap or 25 hours a week such as dual enrollment or virtual classes outside the traditional school day and year.

Provide funding to establish an annual summer institute for Cuban-American studies.

Support the appropriations of resources to fund strategies to teach and promote racial and social justice, unity and harmony among students.

ACCOUNTABILITY AND ASSESSMENT REFORM:

Revise the definition of low-performing schools by eliminating the criteria of earning a "B" or higher in the most recent two years.

Establish required credentials and regulations for Education Advocates who charge fees for their service.

Ensure that the General Equivalency Diploma (GED) test is offered in Haitian Creole.

SCHOOL SECURITY/SAFETY

Amend F.S. 316.172 to allow local school boards to install cameras on school buses to aid in the enforcement of school bus safety laws and authorize the enforcement of such by local certified law enforcement agencies.

Amend the Marjory Stoneman Douglas Safety Act to facilitate the requirement of charter schools reporting their SESIR incident data independently of school districts.

Support legislation that requires students to have immunizations, inclusive of the influenza vaccination, to enroll in public-funded education.

CHARTER SCHOOLS:

Allow school districts with at least 15 percent of total student enrollment in charter schools to analyze the need for additional charter schools and/or require new charters to locate in areas to address overcrowding, provide choice opportunities to students/parents zoned to failing schools, or meet a specific academic need the school district is not addressing.

Require charter schools to submit facility occupancy and use documentation by the 30th day prior to the first day of the school year. If unable to meet the deadline, the school may default to an automatic deferral and planning year.

Support legislation that:

- prohibits applicants with existing schools under academic or financial corrective action plans, investigation, or some other kind of sanction to apply for an additional charter schools;
- strengthens accountability, protects taxpayers' investment and ensures compliance with charter school fiduciary responsibilities;
- requires charter schools that have been in operation for less than five years and/or in financial distress to place funds in an escrow account to cover expenditures associated with closure such as final audits, legal fees, corporate dissolution, asset retrieval, bankruptcy fines, and the value of at least one payroll payment.

Protect taxpayers' interest by attaching a proprietary interest equal to the value of the allocation from the local discretionary capital outlay levy revenue provided to charter schools, and prohibit charter operators from personal enrichment from public funds.

FACILITIES:

Modify the utilization factor for K-8 centers as follows: 100% of Florida Inventory of School Houses for elementary school student stations, and 95% for middle school student stations.

Exempt school districts from paying ad valorem tax for leased properties similar to charter schools' exemption.

CHOICE:

Amend the Hope Scholarships to apply only to "substantiated" incidents of harassment, bullying, and battery.

CYBERSECURITY

Strengthen the state's Cybersecurity Task Force role and require that it develop and share best practices and guidelines to protect student, parent, and employee information as well as provide funding to school districts to upgrade and strengthen its controls.

POLICY STATEMENTS:

Funding

Fully fund the Florida Education Funding Program components, class size reduction requirement while providing increases to the BSA and other components of the FEFP.

Examine Florida's tax structure and phase out sales tax exemptions for non-essential goods and services; ensure that internet sales remit necessary sales tax to Florida.

Support funding to offer an extended school year beyond 180 days for all students.

Maintain the current required employers' contribution rate to the Florida Retirement System by absorbing any planned increase in local employers' contribution.

Support continued state funding for the administration of college entrance exams, SAT or ACT, during school days.

Oppose any further compression of the Discretionary Millage.

Ensure that required sharing of referenda monies with charter schools remains prospective for any referendum passed after July 1, 2019.

Support funding for Adults with Disabilities.

Restore funding for New World School of the Arts.

Fully fund school districts' instructional materials needs.

Support increased funding to meet the demands for workforce skills development programs.

Establish that performance-based salary adjustments are annual and not recurring.

Ensure that any changes to the District Cost Differential take into account cost differences integral to educational institutions' operations reflecting such costs as average teacher salaries, health insurance for employees, property insurance per FTE, housing, and transportation costs per FTE.

Provide school districts with greater flexibility of its use of Title I funds by separating the indirect cost from the 10 percent allowable administrative set-aside and increasing the allowable educational services set-aside to 10 percent.

Require advertising a tax increase only when the cumulative tax millage is greater than the prior levy and not simply because the ad valorem tax basis generates more proceeds.

Increase the ESE Guarantee Allocation to account for student growth and inflationary costs.

Eliminate the arbitrary cap on the number of gifted high school students funded.

Support supplemental funding to create community-based networks that develop, coordinate and provide quality education, parental training, accessible health care, housing, youth development programs, and employment opportunities to ensure safe neighborhoods for children and their families.

Restore school districts discretionary lottery to pre-recessionary levels.

Preserve funding that allows M-DCPS to assist refugee and immigrant students and their families or that negatively impacts our students' ability to obtain an education in Florida.

Allocate funds directed to provide supplemental services and support to at-risk students.

Restore funding for the Digital Classroom Allocation to address new secondary school computer science requirement and other school technology needs.

Capital Funding

Provide adequate school construction funding to support new and existing facilities, technology, maintenance, land acquisition and class size reduction needs through the establishment of long-term, stable and recurring revenue sources to fulfill the state's educational facility needs.

Fully fund the Public Education Capital Outlay Program that involves construction and maintenance programs for public school districts and ensures that school districts receive their fair share.

Oppose any further reduction in capital millage available to school districts for the purpose of balancing the operating budget.

Oppose any attempt to equalize the capital outlay levy.

Oppose the deletion of impact fees unless replaced with another revenue source.

Expand the allowable use of a locally voted upon sales tax to include operating expenses that maintain, renovate, or repair existing school facilities or maintain, secure, or upgrade school technology equipment.

Governance

Oppose legislation that subverts district governance of constitutionally elected local school boards and elected or appointed superintendents.

WHEREAS, on December 23, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-315 (the "Executive Order"), establishing a priority list of population groups eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine during phase one of Florida's COVID-19 vaccination distribution plan (the "Vaccine Distribution Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Miami Springs (the "City") is home to various schools, including, for example, Miami Springs Senior High School, Miami Springs Middle School, Miami Springs Elementary, Springview Elementary, and other private and charter schools; and

WHEREAS, teachers are among the most important essential workers in the community—inspiring, educating, and enriching the lives our children; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Order's Vaccine Distribution Plan does not include teachers in the COVID-19 vaccination priority list; and

WHEREAS, despite the difficulties of teaching during the COVID-19 pandemic, it is critical that our teachers continue teaching students to ensure a highly educated populace; and

WHEREAS, in order to protect our community's teachers, the City firmly believes that teachers should be included in the phase one Vaccine Distribution Plan priority list; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that this Resolution is in the best interest and welfare of the residents of the City to urge Florida Governor DeSantis to move quickly to amend Executive Order 20-315 to include teachers in the phase one Vaccine Distribution Plan priority list.

DISCUSSION: On September 18th, 2020, the City advertised in the Daily Business Review, on our City's website and also on Demand Star (Onvia) RFQ #01-19/20 consulting services to perform Continuing Professional Architectural & Engineering Services. We notified (28) twenty-eight firms by email of the opportunity to respond and (86) eighty-six firms downloaded the RFQ from Demand Star. On October 1, 2020 (47) forty-seven individuals attended a Mandatory Pre-Bid conference (Attachment "A") and on November 19th, 2020 the City received (15) fifteen responses (Attachment "B"). Responses were reviewed and evaluated by a selection committee comprised of Chris Heid, City Planner; Chris Perez sitting in for Lazaro Garaboa, Public Works Director (Public Works Dept), and Rogelio A. Madan, AICP Chief of Community Planning & Sustainability for City of Miami Beach in a public meeting on February 2nd, 2021. The selection committee ranked the (15) fifteen firms (Attachment "C"). Three (3) consultant firms were short-listed in which Bermello Ajamil & Partners, Inc., was considered the highest ranked and most qualified respondent (Attachment "D"), following in second place was BCC Engineering and lastly following in third place was Alleguez Architecture.

The architecture creates a modern statement thru overall vernacular shape, massing, fenestration and materials giving it its own identity while complementing the adjacent City Hall. The design of the exterior spaces of the triangle parcel provides an aesthetically pleasing and physical connection to the existing Downtown Doral Park and shall include sidewalks, furniture, landscape, irrigation and suggested locations for public art.

MIAMI SPRINGS ADULT COMMUNITY CENTER

Miami Springs, Florida



Completion Date: 2020

The new Miami Springs Adult Community Center is a one-story building designed to promote an enhanced quality of life for a diverse population of older adults residing in the Miami Springs community. Safety was key to designing this project. The Adult Community Center accommodates the pedestrian traffic flow between the existing ballfield and playground area usage of the new Senior Center bathroom facility. The relationship between these three components was vitally important in the design as they share an extremely tight site. However, all project factors were taken into account as BA prepared various site planning options for the City's facility to house the Miami Springs Elderly Services Department's services and activities. Through the new 11,250-SF Senior Center, the Department is able to provide a comprehensive and coordinated system of services for local residents to include: congregate meals, home-delivered meals, nutrition education, and counseling, health and wellness activities, recreation, transportation, adult education, screening and assessment, advocacy, and information and referral assistance., In keeping with planned federal and statewide goals, the Elderly Services Department serves as a partner and stakeholder in Florida's aging services network and shares in the common objective to help elderly individuals remain independent and productive.

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MIAMI SPRINGS AQUATIC FACILITY

Miami Springs, Florida



Completion Date: 2016

Bermello Ajamil & Partners, Inc. (BA) prepared a design criteria package for a new Aquatic Facility for the City of Miami Springs. The project includes the demolition of the existing pool, deck, building and parking lot, a new hybrid pool, pool deck, pool building, multi-purpose building, parking lot, landscaping and site improvements.

BA services include: preliminary design, community presentations, community surveys, city council presentations, preparation of the design criteria package, assistance during bidding phase, and owner's representative services during the construction phase.



IVES ESTATES PARK AND COMMUNITY CENTER Miami, Florida



Completion Date: On-going

Ives Estates Park, located near the Miami-Dade/Broward County line to the Northeast of Miami-Dade County, is a 92.46-acre existing suburban park with a number of recreational activities, including fitness equipment, playground, football fields, baseball diamonds, and a recreation center. As part of an expansion and in compliance with the Master Plan, BA is designing the Adult Sports Complex which includes: three (3) lighted, natural turf soccer fields with bleachers, an extensive walking path with connections to existing and proposed facilities, and a 3,200 square foot fieldhouse, three lighted softball diamonds, associated parking, picnic shelters and a maintenance facility and service yard. BA will be providing design solutions, preparing construction drawings, and providing bidding and construction administration to Miami-Dade County Parks, Recreation and Open Space Department. The project has an \$18,000,000.00 budget and is projected to take two years to complete.





DORAL TRIANGLE PARK & CULTURAL ARTS COMMUNITY CENTER Doral, Florida



Completion Date: Est. 2022

The Doral Triangle Project consists of the design of a 12,500-SF cultural arts center and surrounding park space for the 1.44-acre triangle shaped parcel located in Downtown Doral. As the Project Architect, BA prepared two (2) alternative conceptual designs, opinions of probable cost for each and presented them at a public workshop. The building includes space for a lobby and visitor center, cultural arts room, multi-purpose room and reading room. The project required the full integration of the proposed cultural arts center building into the overall proposed and existing park design, so both building and park complement and enhance the overall experience of Downtown Doral. The architecture creates a modern statement thru overall vernacular shape, massing, fenestration and materials giving it its own identity, while complementing the adjacent City Hall. The design of the exterior spaces provides an aesthetically pleasing physical connection to the existing Downtown Doral Park and shall include sidewalks, furniture, landscape, irrigation and suggested locations for public art.





SULLIVAN PARK Deerfield Beach, Florida

2017 Project of the Year ASCE Florida- Broward County Branch



Completion Date: 2017

Bermello Ajamil & Partners, Inc. (BA) developed alternative master plan concepts for an existing 3-acre, underutilized waterfront park. Although the existing park was visually isolated due to its location and poorly maintained, the City wished to incorporate the park into redevelopment of the waterfront and the City's new commercial core to the south. With a significant historical background, the site offered an opportunity to educate park users about the colorful history of the community and the role the site played in that history. A primary goal of the park master plan and design was to provide an interpretive program for visitors.

The approved development program for the revitalized park included two playgrounds, a restroom pavilion, picnic shelters, an interactive water feature, a 15-foot-wide waterfront promenade and a new stair tower to connect the site to the bridge leading over to the City's beachfront area. Since the City has limited intracoastal waterfront access, one of the primary goals for the park's redevelopment was to increase public access to the water. This was accomplished by incorporating a small marina along the north shoreline of the park and a floating dock along the east shoreline for safely launching paddle boards and kayaks into the water. Through meetings with City staff and neighboring residents, a final concept design was selected and approved by the CRA.





SENIOR ACTIVITY CENTER Pompano Beach, Florida



Completion Date: Ongoing

This Senior Activity Center has been designed to service the growing, active, senior community in Pompano Beach. This 8,528 sf facility will provide a wide variety of services such as exercise and art classes, dining/party facilities, bingo, movies, and other exciting services for this senior community. The Center contains 4 activity rooms, a personal services room and a glazed fitness center with a direct view of the beautiful, landscaped rear yard. The large, 2,400 sf activity room can be divided into 2 activity rooms and serviced by a 300 sf catering kitchen. This large room has access to a covered patio that leads to a heavily landscaped yard which includes a butterfly garden, and an exercise walkway with space for 2 future gazebos. The Center's support spaces include the administration office, restrooms, storage and back of house areas. The 2,200 port cochere and covered entrance are a key architectural feature providing much-needed cover upon arrival to the center.



POMPANO BEACH LIBRARY Pompano Beach, Florida



Completion Date: 2015

Bermello Ajamil & Partners, Inc. (BA) served as the Landscape Architects for this new joint venture between the City of Pompano Beach and the County Library System to build a new library at the beach to replace the outdated building in an adjacent lot. BA developed the overall site plan and the landscape design for both the parking and public open space adjacent to the building.

Due to the extensive tree and palm coverage on the site, BA developed a plan to relocate and preserve most of the existing trees. Large seagrapes were relocated onsite and create a dramatic impact to the new landscape design. The public open space is intended to provide outdoor space for the library users in addition to the covered veranda and a focal point for public art.



TRUMAN WATERFRONT PARK COMMUNITY CENTER Key West, Florida



Completion Date: 2019

BA was commissioned by the City of Key West to develop an overall master plan for this 23-acre waterfront site adjacent to the historic Fort Zachary Taylor Park and Naval Base. Working with the City, the community, and nearby neighborhoods, BA developed an overall plan that would attract residents and visitors to the waterfront. The entire development of the Truman waterfront is envisioned as a water-related, park-like environment where the City will enjoy the revenue from various commercial components to assist in the expenses of maintaining a world-class park.

The park master plan incorporates a redesigned 50-foot-wide waterfront pedestrian promenade, a pedestrian bridge to span Admiral's Cut, an open-air amphitheater with 200 fixed seats, a renovated Navy Generator Building to be reused as a restaurant, historical museum and public restrooms, an interactive water feature with two adjacent shaded playgrounds, an exercise trail with outdoor exercise stations, a 35,000-SF recreation center with an adjacent synthetic turf multi-purpose athletic and event field, and new horse stables for the Key West Police Department.



HIGHLANDS COMMUNITY CENTER Deerfield Beach, Florida



Completion Date: 2015

BA was commissioned by the City of Deerfield Beach to design a new 3,500 square foot Community Center located at 571 NE 44th Street in south Deerfield Beach. The new community center was inserted into the existing 2.16-acre triangular park to accommodate a variety of community-based functions. The main multi-purpose space can be divided into (2) two separate spaces that accommodate a variety of uses at the same time. The facility has a dedicated service area for catering.

The park already has adequate parking and utilities to accommodate the new building; site improvements include additional landscaping, new sidewalks to the building (main entry/front and a separate service/back of the house), and new shade over the existing playground area. The building is designed to accommodate emergency operation communications for the community before, during, and after a hurricane.



Joseph Caleb Center Courthouse and Parking Garage, Miami, Florida

Bermello Ajamil & Partners, Inc. (BA) was retained by Miami-Dade County to provide the architectural and landscape architectural design of additions to the Caleb Center Courthouse and the design of its new Parking Garage facility.

The new parking facility which contains 357 parking spaces and approximately 49,694 SF of constructed area to accommodate parking booths, control gates and 20 private spaces on the ground floor area.


