PLEASE BE AWARE

Residents of Miami Springs must have a city license to operate or will face severe fines.

If you engage in short-term vacation rentals, you risk losing your homestead exemption in accordance with Florida Statute 196.061

If you are a homeowner who rents out all or a substantial amount of your homestead property for more than 30 days per year for two consecutive years, you will lose your homestead exemption and will be subject to penalties.

Any property operating a short-term rental without a city license will be fined **\$250** for the first offense and **\$500** for the second offense.

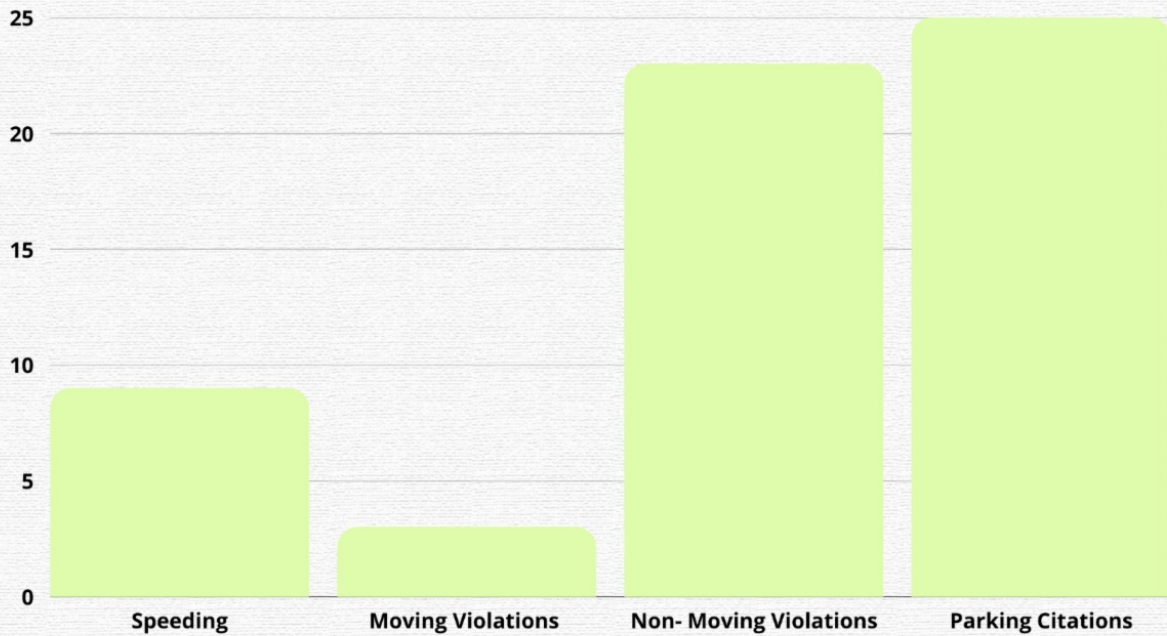

Disaster Preparedness 2022 Sales Tax Holiday

May 28- June 10

\$2 or less

- Cans of pouches of wet pet food

\$15 or less

- Manual can openers
- Collapsible or travel-sized food/water bowls for pets
- Pet waste disposal bags
- Hamster or rabbit substrate

\$20 or less

- Reusable ice
- Leashes, collars, and muzzles for pets
- Pet pads

\$30 or less

- Bags of dry pet food weighing 15 or fewer pounds

\$40 or less

- Portable self-powered light source
- Pet beds

\$50 or less

- Portable self-powered radios, two-way radios, or weather-band radios
- Gas or diesel fuel tanks
- Batteries, including rechargeable batteries, listed sizes only:
 - AA-cell
 - AAA-cell
 - C-cell
 - D-cell
 - 6-Volt
 - 9-Volt

\$60 or less

- Nonelectric food storage coolers
- Portable power banks

\$70 or less

- Smoke detectors or smoke alarms
- Fire extinguishers
- Carbon monoxide detectors

- Tarpaulins or other flexible waterproof sheeting

- Portable generators used to provide light or to preserve food in a power shortage

Emergency supplies should be fully stocked, the start of hurricane season is here. Once a hurricane warning is declared, most of your preparations should be directed toward your home.



KITS AND CHECKLIST



You and your family members may not be together when a hurricane is approaching. Plan ahead and talk about what you will do before, during and after a hurricane. Discuss how you will get to a safe place, get in touch with each other and get back to each other.

Your plan should contain:

- **Phone numbers of a pre-assigned contact person for family members to call**
- **List and contact information of family members, friends, neighbors and physicians**
- **A safe place to store important documents in a waterproof container or bag**
- **How you will get assistance if needed for older adults or those with functional needs in the home**
- **How to turn off the water, gas and electricity safely**

FAMILY EMERGENCY PLAN



A supply kit is a container of items your family may need in or after an emergency. Most of the items can be found in your house.

It is important to put them in one place. Be sure every family member knows where the kit is kept.

- Keep loose items in airtight plastic bags.
- Gather the kit's items in easy-to-carry containers or duffel bags. Put them within reach, near the exit you use most often.
- Check and update your kit at least once a year.



HURRICANE SUPPLY KIT



YOUR HURRICANE SUPPLY KIT SHOULD CONTAIN:

- 7-day supply of non-perishable foods
- 7-day supply of water (one gallon per person per day, including pets)
- A manual can opener
- Battery-powered portable television or radio with extra batteries
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- First aid kit and manual
- Sanitation and hygiene items, such as instant hand sanitizing gel, disinfectant wipes, moist towelettes, toilet paper, and feminine hygiene products
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), such as masks and gloves
- Thermometer with batteries, if required
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Whistle
- Kitchen accessories and cooking utensils
- Cash
- Extra clothing, blankets and sleeping bags
- Photocopies of identification, insurance, prescriptions, household inventory, credit cards and your utility bill
- Copies of important documents such as birth certificates, adoption certificates, marriage licenses, divorce papers, Social Security cards, passport, green cards, will, insurance policies (home, auto, life, health, etc.), bank statements
- Prescription medications, eyeglasses, contact lens solution and hearing aid
- Batteries
- Type ABC fire extinguisher
- Telephone that is not dependent on electricity and/or a cell phone
- Formula, baby food, diapers and pacifiers
- Pet carriers, leashes, shot records, and food for each animal evacuating with you
- Tire repair kit, booster cables, pump and flares
- Toys and games for children
- Mosquito repellent
- Sunscreen (45 SPF recommended)



How Miami Springs is
preparing for a storm this
weekend.

From our Parks and Recreation Department

- Lower the water table at the Aquatic Center
- Flip all trash receptacles at our parks



From our Public Works Department

- Storm Drains are being monitored for debris and cleaned if needed
- Please do not trim trees at this time prior to the anticipated rain event
- Refrain from placing tree trimmings and bulk trash on swales or alley at this time
- This can cause a hazard on the roads and storm drains



From our Adult Community Center

- They are monitoring the system/weather.
- If there are any changes they will notify the seniors via telephone.



From the South Florida Water Management District

- They are preparing for heavy rains associated with the system, all Miami Dade County District canals are in low range



From our Public Information and Professional Services Specialist.

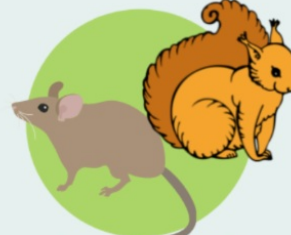
