### Miami Springs Police Department Shares Statistics: Traffic Violations

- The Citation reports show that in 2017 4,703 traffic summonses (speeding, running stop signs, etc.) were issued, compared to 2,995 in 2016. An increase of 57%.
- In 2017, 3,841 traffic stops were conducted, compared to 1,718 in 2016. An increase of 124%.
- In 2017 Miami Springs Police Officers made 445 arrests compared to 268 in 2016. An increase of 66%.
- · On average, traffic on the incoming bridge between the hours of 6 a.m. and 9 a.m. each weekday morning, 5,000 - 5,500 cars enter the City of Miami Springs.
- Average response time by Miami Springs Police Officers is 2:45 – 3:00 minutes. The national average is 8 min-
- Due to vacancies caused by retirements and resignations, the Miami Springs Police Department has had 2

openings for approximately the last 8 months. By the be-
ginning of May 2018, the police department will be fully
staffed with the swearing in of 2 new officers. Note: In the
last 3 years we have had 4 Police Officers resign to go work
at other police departments.

- The budget for Police in 2013 was approximately \$5.8 million, the budget for Fiscal Year 2018 is \$6.5 million, an increase of 12% over the past 5 years. Our Police budget represents about 41% of our total General Fund Budget.
- Finally, the number of sworn Officers the City has been working with for the past 30 years has not changed. Our City has 43 Officers, which represents a ratio of about 3 Officers per 1,000 in population...compared to Doral with a 1.92 ratio, Hialeah with a 1.24 ratio, and the City of Miami with a 3.18 ratio.

### **Did You Know?**

Residents of Miami Springs have always taken great pride in maintaining their properties beautiful. In continuing to keep the City's beautiful appearance, the Public Works Department requests your help! Illegal dumping of construction material has been a recent issue. For starters, dumping of any construction material such as shingles and/or dry wall (with the exception of wood) in your trash is not permitted, and is subject to a violation. Furthermore, dumping construction material in your neighbors' lot and/or any vacant lot, is definitely illegal, and is subject to a fine. City Code, Section 93-11. States that "It shall be unlawful for any person to dump or bury any waste on public or private property unless written permission has been obtained from the respective property owner or owners and such disposal has been authorized by the director of public works" (Ord. 351, passed 4-11-66; amend. Ord. 586-76, passed 9-13-76; amend. Ord. 606-77, passed 9-26-77). - Penalty, § 93-99.

Solid Waste Management of Florida's Code of Ordinances Chapter 15 states that "littering, dumping, and unauthorized delivery prohibited; dumping or burying solid waste without proper authorization; unauthorized deliver of solid waste at neighborhood trash and recycling centers; declared public nuisance; presumption" (Sec. 15-6).

It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to prevent "the abuse of the environment through acts classified as dumping and litter-



ing", in which these acts severely burden the taxpayers of Miami-Dade County, negatively affect the attractiveness of the City, and generally affects public health, safety, and the welfare of its residents and visitors (Dade Clean County Ordinance). Please reference 403.413 Florida Litter Law for specific details.

Come join the Miami Springs Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) in a one day National Take Back Initiative to remove potentially dangerous controlled substances from our nation's medicine cabinets.

For your convenience, a collection site will be established at the Community Policing Office, located at 274 Westward Drive on Saturday, April 28th, from 10:00 am until 2:00pm where you will be able to dispose of any expired, unwanted or unused medications.

All you have to do is bring any of your un-

wanted prescription or over the counter medicines to the collection site. If leaving medication in their original containers, all personal information must be removed from the label. We also ask that you keep any liquid medicine, such as cough syrup, in the original containers and to make sure the caps are tightly secured to prevent leaks.

Intra-venous (IV) solutions, injectables and syringes will not be accepted due to potential hazards posed by blood-borne pathogens. Illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamines are not part of this initiative.

# **BUILDING & CODE COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT**

# and all that Rubbish

Recently we have had many complaints from residents and Public Works sanitation Department regarding the placement of trash on the swales, of recyclable bins being left out on swale for days, and the placement of non-combustible materials in the trash

Garbage, Trash

Properties with alley ways can place their trash behind their property as long as they don't obstruct the right-of-way for the City Vehicles. Recycling bins need to be brought into the property within 24 hours from pick

Construction materials, tires, concrete or other non-combustible materials will not be picked up by the Sanitation Department; there are special locations to be taken to in Miami Dade. Please call 311 for areas according to the materials to be disposed.

Multi- Family buildings and commercial buildings can only place the trash 24 hours prior to the pickup date. In cases where large amounts of trash will be placed, please call Public Works Department for special

The City appreciates your cooperation to this matter in an effort to keep our City looking beautiful.

- Sec. 93-05. Garbage, garden trash, and rubbish; placement in receptacles for collection and removal; placement for pickup and retrieval of containers.
- (D) Loose trash, including bagged materials, white goods, furniture, and any other non-containerized or containerized trash materials may not be placed for pick up by any multi-family residential or commercial site adjacent to any City street earlier than 24 hours prior to any scheduled pick up. Any receptacles used for the disposal of these materials must be retrieved and returned to the interior of the site within 24 hours of pick
- (E) In addition to the provision of subsection (D) above, all recycling containers may not be placed for pick up by any multi-family residential or commercial site adjacent to any City street earlier than 24 hours prior to any scheduled pick up. All recycling containers must be retrieved and returned to the interior of the property site within 24 hours of pick
- (F) The provisions of subsections (D) and (E) above shall not be applicable to any pick ups performed in City alleys and in the single family residentially zoned districts of the

### **Miami-Dade County Water Restrictions**

- Watering is not allowed between 10 a.m.
- Hand-watering with one hose fitted with an automatic shut-off nozzle is allowed for 10 minutes per day for landscape stress relief and to prevent plant die-off.
- Restrictions apply to all users of any water resource within Miami-Dade County, whether from publicly or privately-owned water utility sewer systems, private wells or private connections to surface water bodies.
- Residents and businesses with an ODDnumbered street address (ending in 1, 3, 5,
- Lawn watering is permitted on WEDNESDAYS and SATURDAYS from 4 p.m.
- Residents and businesses with an EVENnumbered street address
- (ending in 0, 2, 4, 6, 8\*), no street address, or who water both even and odd addresses within the same zones, including multi-family units and Homeowner Associa-
- Lawn watering is permitted on THURS-DAYS and SUNDAYS from 4 p.m. to 10 a.m.

Residents should choose from one of two "watering windows" (before 10 a.m. or after 4 p.m.) on their designated irrigation days. For the most efficient use of water, residents should avoid irrigating during both time periods on the same day.

### Some exceptions

Restrictions don't apply for car and boat washing, pressure cleaning of paved surfaces, decorative fountains and water-based recreation (e.g. swimming pools, water slides).

Users of 100 percent reclaimed water are exempt from restrictions, but encouraged to conserve water.

Low-volume irrigation, including the use of drop and micro jet systems that apply water directly to plant root zones, is not restricted but is encouraged to be reduced.

### Newly-planted gardens and landscaping

New landscaping can be watered during the corresponding hours listed above every day, except Fridays, for the first 90 days it is installed. Save the receipt with the date of purchase. When unable to water during specific hours, call 3-1-1 to apply for a variance.
