

Home Drowning Prevention Tips

More than 1,000 children die from drowning in the United States each year and another 5,000 are injured, but these casualties have declined dramatically since the early 1990s, a new study shows. The number of children who died annually from drowning after being admitted to a hospital has declined. Total trips to hospitals, after drowning-related incidents, has declined by 51 percent among children during that time.

Drowning injuries are the second leading cause of accidental trauma in children in the United States. Nonfatal drowning often results in brain damage and longterm disability, according studies.

Breaking down different levels of risk, studies have found that children less than 4 years old are most likely to die in drowning incidents, usually in bathtubs or after falling into water. Older children are more likely to drown while swimming, according to research cited in the studies, with higher risks in the in the warmer regions like those found in Southern Florida due to the warmer temperatures providing for longer swimming seasons.

Federal legislation passed in 2007 requiring pool and hot tub drains to have covers and calling for other safety measures to be taken by states. The law followed the drowning death of a child whose mother was unable to free her from the suction of a hot-tub drain.



We need to continue our diligence to reduce drowning-related deaths and injuries.

• Always stay within an arm's reach of your infant or toddler when he or she is in or near the bathtub, toilet, pools, spas or buckets. Never leave your child alone or in the care of older children during bath time.

• Once bath time is over, immediately drain the tub.

• Empty all buckets, containers and wading pools immediately after use. Store them upside-down and out of children's reach.


• Keep toilet lids closed and use toilet seat locks.

• Never leave your child unattended in a tub or around any other body of water, even if he or she knows how to swim.

• Keep doors to bathrooms and laundry rooms closed.

• Children in baby bath seats and rings must be watched every second.

However a Variance can be granted if it is impossible to park the recreational vehicle in the rear yard setback. We want to wish all our residents a safe and enjoyable summer.
