Please keep in mind that traffic conditions affect the time timetable, and the bus may run 15 minutes late at any given time. The bus is wheelchair accessible, and it is equipped with bicycle racks. ## Back to School Safety Tips

With another school year beginning, the Miami Springs Police Department would like to offer the following tips to help make our school zones safer and improve traffic safety.

With school in session, there will be significantly more traffic. Pedestrians, bicyclists, buses and parents all contribute to school zone congestion. Most schools in Miami Springs and other cities are faced with traffic issues such as double parking, speeding, unsafe U-turns, jaywalking and more.

In addition, children do not always follow the rules of the road. Often times they enter the street from between two cars, and run into traffic, ride their bicycles through red lights, skateboard into traffic and don't cross the road at marked crosswalks.

Motorists should exercise a heightened awareness in and around a school zone. Potential hazards are much easier to perceive when driving at or below the school zone speed limit of 15 mph. Special attention must also be paid to buses displaying flashing red lights when on an undivided two-lane roadway. In these instances, motorists are required by the Florida Law to stop in either direction, and wait until the flashing red lights are turned off before passing the bus.

Parents who allow their children to ride bicycles to school should keep in mind that a helmet is required for those under the age of 16. In addition, children riding bicycles must travel with the flow of traffic. When considering whether to allow your child to ride a bike to school, also think about the effect that a bulky backpack may have on your child's balance while he or she is riding a bike.

**Follow these simple suggestions to help make school zones safer for everyone:**

- Obey all posted traffic signs and signals.
- Don't speed.
- Don't impede traffic by dropping children off in the middle of the street.
- Don't double park.



- Don't STOP or PARK on a Crosswalk - this is against the law.
- Don't block intersections or driveways if you park your vehicle.
- Don't make U-turns.
- Obey the Crossing Guards and School Officials, they are there to protect the children.
- Always make sure that your children are wearing seatbelts when transporting them to and from school.
- If driving behind a school bus, drivers should allow a greater following distance than if driving behind a car. It will allow more time to stop once the yellow lights start flashing.
- Miami Springs Municipal Code prohibits parking in the swale areas in front of residences.

In addition, make sure that your child has adequate supervision if he or she arrives home before you do. While this may be difficult for some, any form of organized activity, or the immediate availability of a trusted adult, can provide the necessary guidance to help ensure your child's safety and also give you peace of mind. Miami Springs has several private after school care facilities and a City sponsored program through the Miami Springs Community Center.

### Do I need a permit?

In general, any maintenance and repairs under \$500\*\* can be done without a permit. **HOWEVER, THERE ARE EXCEPTIONS AS FOLLOWS:**

- All Structural work must have a permit.
- All Exterior Windows or Doors, new or replacement, must have a permit.
- All Drywall work must have a permit.
- All Stucco work must have a permit.
- All Fascia must have a permit (Per Building Official, this is a new rule as it may affect structural, roof, drip, etc.).
- All gutters must have a permit.
- All Electric other than simple fixture change outs\*\*\* must have a permit.
- All Plumbing other than simple repairs (leaks, etc.) must have a permit. All fixture additions or replacements must have a permit.
- All Mechanical/Air Conditioning work must have a permit. This would include any replacement of condensing units or air handlers and any addition of duct. For other maintenance such as cleaning coils or ducts, the \$500 rule would apply.
- All Roofing work valued at over \$300\*\* or 3 squares (3 squares=300 square feet) must have a permit and any roofing with hot mop or structural must have a permit.
- Replacing Cabinets does require a permit. By the Electrical Code, if you replace cabinets you must upgrade the electric out-

lets to the current Code as to distance, number, GFI, etc. so a permit is required for that and for any CHANGE to the plumbing configuration. The cabinets themselves require a miscellaneous permit to inspect that the installation was done properly.

- ALL fencing must have a permit.
- Any fencing repairs where support posts or poles are replaced must have a permit. If only changing the chain link or wood panels and not changing the support posts, then the \$500 rule applies.
- ALL slabs, pavers, driveways, walkways or any other type of permanent ground covering must have a permit (including gravel driveways).

### Political Signs

During this election season, please remember the following guidelines regarding political signs:

1. Only one sign per candidate or ballot issue per property.
2. No Political signs on public property, including your swale area.
3. Where there is no sidewalk, please place political signs ten feet from the roadway.
4. No illuminated signs
5. No signs that inhibit visibility or passage on a public right of way.
6. Please remove all signs within ten (10) days of the end of the election.

### Take caution: Trees in power lines

Residents who have trees in power lines must call Florida Power & Light (FPL) to report a trimming request. Requests are to be made directly through FPL and not the City's Public Works Department.

The Florida Power & Light Distribution Vegetation Management for the South Region advises that FPL has a process for all "customer" trim requests. The property

owner should call the FPL customer care network, the number is on the FPL website and the customer's bill; 1-800-226-3545. This ensures their inquiry is properly logged into the FPL system with a work request number, for tracking purposes. The request is field investigated by a trained arborist and the results are shared with the customer.

The Miami Springs Senior Center offers a variety of FREE activities and services to older residents of Miami Springs and Virginia Gardens, age 60 and over. Current financial and programmatic support comes from: the City of Miami Springs, the Alliance for Aging, Inc., the Florida Department of Elder Affairs, the Village of Virginia Gardens, Mount Sinai Medical Center, participant donations, local business organizations, medical doctors, civic groups and countless volunteers.

### CONGREGATE MEALS:

Hot lunch meals are served weekdays from 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. to assist area seniors in maintaining a nutritionally balanced diet and to provide opportunities to volunteer and socialize with their peers.

### TRANSPORTATION:

Daily pick up, utilizing the Hialeah-MS Rotary Charitable Foundation bus, is provided to older residents with no means of transportation to and from the center.

- Weekly trips to grocery stores, assistance with shopping and carrying packages is provided.
- Field trips to malls and other places of interest are scheduled each month.
- Trips currently scheduled for September: Walmart (9/6), Sabor (9/13), Fresco y Mas (9/21) and Publix (9/27).

### RECREATION ACTIVITIES:

Recreational and social events are planned each month at the senior center. As of this writing, the following activities are planned for September: birthday and anniversary celebration (9/20); weekly Bingo games (9/4, 9/10, 9/17, and 9/24); and shopping trips to

Walmart and various grocery stores each week.

### HEALTH SUPPORT PROGRAMS AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS:

• Educational presentations are scheduled each month through the sponsorship of numerous individuals, community service organizations, businesses, and medical facilities. New programs and lectures are being planned and will be announced as finalized. The following topics are currently scheduled for September:

• **Miami Springs Lions Club Projects** – On September 5th at 12:15 p.m., Lee Fisher, President of the local Lions Club, will present information on the many projects the members are working on for the benefit of others.

• **Miami-Dade Public Library System's TECHNOBUS** -- The library's mobile technology innovation lab will visit the senior center on the September 11th and 25th from 10:00—11:30 a.m. The bus brings digital services and devices directly to the senior center and provides residents of all ages with instruction and activities on how to use smart phones, laptops, iPads, MacBook Airs, and Microsoft Surface Pro tablets. Those interested in learning more about technology are encouraged to stop by and visit.

• **"Library Happenings"** – A representative of the Miami Springs Branch Library, will present information about library services and upcoming events on September 11th at 12:15 p.m.

• **"Cancer Prevention and Medical Intervention"** – On September 12th at 12:15 p.m., United Health Center will sponsor a program on this topic.

• **"Crime Watch" Program** -- Offi-

cers Jorge Capote and Janice Simon, from the MSPD's Community Policing Office, will facilitate the monthly crime watch meeting at the senior center on September 18th at 12:15 p.m. The Officers will inform attendees about current crimes being committed in the City, solicit observations and questions from the participants, and provide tips on how to avoid becoming a victim.

• **Distribution of Telephones for the Hearing Impaired** – On September 19th, at 12:15 p.m., a presentation will be made on the Specialized Telecommunications Equipment Distribution Program for citizens of Florida who are Deaf, Hard of Hearing, Deaf/Blind and Speech Disabled. Under the State of Florida Telecommunications Access Systems Act, specialized telephones are made available free to new clients with a hearing aid or to those who are hear-

ing or speech impaired. Free amplified telephones will be distributed on September 19th following the presentation at the Miami Springs Senior Center. To qualify, you must show proof of permanent residency and have a landline in your residence. If you do not wear a hearing aid, a 5 minute hearing test will be administered. Current clients who have an inoperable telephone (that was previously issued through this program) may exchange it for a new one on this date starting at 11:00 a.m.

• **"Protect Yourself from Financial Exploitation and Identity Theft"** – The Alliance for Aging, Inc. will present this topic on September 26th at 12:15 p.m.
