Around the Community ... Buzz about Bees

Can you imagine being without coffee or even cotton? We all know that bees make honey, but did you know that if it wasn't for bees, the majority of our food source would be nonexistent?

In an interview with Rey Mazola, a Miami Springs resident, beekeeper, and owner of Project Bee, he explains the impact that bees have on earth, and urges us not to kill bees.

As a civic service, Rey Mazola will come to your house and safely remove the bees, free of charge! "Bees are one of the top pollinators in the world, and if they vanish from earth, mankind will have 4 years" – Rey Mazola. He goes on to say that if we don't bother them, they will not bother us. Once they sting, they die, and he guarantees us, that they don't want to die.

Having the opportunity to be up close and personal with Rey's bee hives, I can vouch for the fact that they are truly busy bees, mining their own business, working away at making honey.





Another way humankind is inadvertently killing these endangered insects, is through pesticides. According to Christina Sarich, author of Honey Love Urban Beekeepers (2013), "In just the last ten years, over 40% of the bee colonies in the US have suffered Colony Collapse Disorder (CCD)", which is likely linked to pesticides.

The Code Compliance Department would like to thank all the residents that have quickly responded and complied with the removal of hurricane shutters. We will continue to monitor and follow-up. We value your support and compliance.

Building permits issued by the City of Miami Springs are required to be properly displayed in a way that is visible from the street

Permit cards are issued for construction work specified only and not as an authority to violate, cancel, alter or set aside any of the provisions of the Florida Building Codes.

Penalties for failure to display Building Permit Card can

result in a fine of \$100 (2017 Florida Building Code Sec. 105.7). Your Building Permit Card is required for all inspections, it's your record of inspections performed and it shows results for the inspections.

Proper display of Building Permit Cards avoids unnecessary field contact with Building Dept and the property owner's. Also, it lessens the amount of calls made to the Code Compliance Department to report construction work being done on properties where a Permit Card is not displayed.



Swale parking ordinance:

- By ordinance, the City of Miami Springs granted property owners preferential rights to the usage of the swale area abutting and adjacent to their property.
- Property owners may permit others to use the swale areas for reasonable purposes.
- Property owners can request unauthorized use to cease. If it does not, property owners can ask assistance from the city's Code Compliance Officers or the Police De-
- Officers will seek voluntary compliance from violators.
