### SENIOR CENTER NEWS

The Miami Springs Senior Center, located on Prince Field at 343 Payne Drive, offers a variety of activities and services to older residents every Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m.--5:00 p.m. Current financial and programmatic support comes from: the City of Miami Springs; the Alliance for Aging, Inc. and the Florida Department of Elder Affairs; the Village of Virginia Gardens; the Miami Springs Adult & Community School; participant donations; local organizations, civic groups and countless volunteers. Residents of Miami Springs, age 60 and over, are eligible to participate in a variety of services and activities offered at the City's senior center.

**CONGREGATE MEALS:** Hot lunch meals are served weekdays from 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. to assist area seniors in maintaining a nutritionally balanced diet and to provide opportunities to volunteer and socialize with their peers.

**NUTRITION EDUCATION:** Counseling and nutrition education programs are provided monthly by the program's consulting Registered Dietician and the Project Director.

### **HEALTH SUPPORT ACTIVITIES:**

- YOGA-STYLE CLASSES are provided free to local residents, age 60 and over, through a partnership with the Miami Springs Adult & Community School, every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:45-10:15 a.m. at the City's Community Center. Class size is limited and participants must complete senior center and school enrollment forms;
- "GET IN SHAPE" EXERCISE CLASSES, free to area seniors, are provided every M-W-F from 10:15-11:00 a.m. at the City's Community Center with Instructor Natasha Salmon-Cogno, Certified Personal Trainer. Class size is limited and pre-registration is required;
- Free CHAIR EXERCISE CLASSES are provided every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 10:45--11:15 a.m. with Instructor
- Free "YOGA-IN-A-CHAIR" CLASSES are offered for seniors on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 9:30-11:00 a.m. at the Community Center. Class size is limited and students must pre-register at the Senior Center office;
- Free LINE DANCING CLASSES are offered every Thursday from 9:30-10:45 a.m. by Instructor Denise Gishler.

**TRANSPORTATION:** Daily pick up, utilizing the city's mini-bus, is provided to older residents with no means of transportation to and from the center. In addition, weekly trips are made to a local grocery store and assistance is given with shopping and carrying packages.

A workshop on PUSHCPR is slated for 5/15 and will demonstrate how to save a life with continuous chest compression CPR. The monthly Crime Watch Program by the City's Community Policing Office is planned for 5/21, a "Nutrition and a Healthy Lifestyle" presentation by American Providers, Inc. is scheduled for 5/22, and the topic "Understanding Hospice Care" by Catholic Hospice is slated for 5/28.

Silver Surfers, a free computer and Internet 5-week training course sponsored by S.T.E.P.S. in the Right Direction, Inc. and the Alliance for Aging, Inc., will be offered for Spanish speakers on Tuesday mornings beginning June 4th. Call to register as class size is limited.

### NATIONAL TAKE-BACK INITIATIVE

### Saturday, April 27, 2013

Come join the Miami Springs Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) in a one day National Take Back Initiative to remove potentially dangerous controlled



substances from our nation's medicine cabinets.

For your convenience, a collection site will be established at the Community Policing Office, located at 274 Westward Drive on Saturday, April 27th, from 10:00 am until 2:00pm where you will be able to dispose of any expired, unwanted or unused medications.

All you have to do is bring any of your unwanted prescription or over the counter medicines to the collection site. If leaving medication in their original containers, all personal information must be removed from the label. We also ask that you keep any liquid medicine, such as cough syrup, in the original containers and to make sure the caps are tightly secured to prevent leaksIntra-venous (IV) solutions, injectables and syringes will not be accepted due to potential hazards posed by blood-borne pathogens. Illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamines are not part of this initiative.

In an effort to help reduce identity theft, promote recycling and provide a way for residents to dispose of sensitive documents the City of Miami Springs Police Department will be hosting a FREE community document shredding event on Thursday, May 2nd from 4pm to 7pm at the Miami Springs Pool Parking Lot, 1401 Westward Drive. This event is open to Miami Springs Residents and Businesses only. In order to serve everybody efficiently, there will be a maximum of four (4) file size boxes per person, in line. Typical paper products to shred include: phone records, receipts, invoices, checks, old medical claims, bank statements, credit cards statements, and any papers with your personal information. Paper clips and staples DO NOT have to be removed.

### A Note from the Ecology Board

This month Miami-Dade County is observing Water Conservation Month. All residents and business owners must remember that we are under water restrictions, and that lawn watering is not allowed between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Residents and businesses with odd-numbered addresses can water on Wednesdays and Saturdays, while those with even-numbered addresses can water on Thursdays and Sundays from midnight to 10 a.m. or from 4 p.m. to 11:59 p.m.

### Some exceptions:

- Restrictions don't apply for car and boat washing, pressure cleaning of paved surfaces, decorative fountains and swimming pools.
- Users of 100 percent reclaimed water are exempt from restrictions, but encouraged to conserve water.
- Low-volume irrigation, including the use of drop and micro jet systems that apply water directly to plant root zones, is not restricted but is encouraged to be reduced.
- Newly-planted gardens and landscaping: New landscaping can be watered during the corresponding hours listed above every day, except Fridays, for the first 90 days it is installed. Save the receipt with the date of purchase.

We can all take additional steps to save water. From free yard evaluations to toilet rebates and much more, Miami-Dade's Water Conservation Program offers valuable programs and tips at www.miamidade.gov/waterconservation/.

Please be aware that residential real estate For Sale signs are only allowed on the property where the house is being offered for sale. One sign is allowed per property, up to 144 Square inches in total size.

Open House signs are allowed ONLY on the day and during the time that an Open House is being held.

- Westward Drive, from Flamingo Circle to Hammond Drive:
- 2) Ludlam Drive, from Lafayette Drive to Crane Avenue:
- 3) Crane Avenue from Thrush Avenue to North Royal Poinciana Boulevard;
- 4) North Royal Poinciana Boulevard, from Albatross Street to Ludlam Drive;
- 5) Morningside Drive in the area where there is a Parkway, from Palmetto Drive to Minola Drive;

- 6) The Parkway triangle located at South Royal Poinciana Blvd. and Ragan Drive;
- 7) The circles on South Drive, DeSoto Drive and Glendale Drive;
- 8) The triangle on Morningside Drive and Lake Drive;
- 9) The triangle at Lenape Drive and Corydon Drive;
- 10) The triangle at Hunting Lodge Drive and North Melrose Drive;
- 11) North and South Melrose Drive on the canal side only.

Please make sure that you do not post any Open House signs or residential For Sale signs in any other than the allowed locations.


