FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION ASSISTANCE

FREE TAX COUNSELING and PREPARA-TION ASSISTANCE for the 2012 tax returns will be offered again, this year by AARP Tax-Aide Counselors to all taxpayers. For over 16 years, these IRS trained and certified counselors have been assisting local residents with their returns and answering questions regard-ing special federal tax provisions for pensions, credit for the elderly or disabled, intangible taxes, and other important issues.

Tax-Aide Counselors will be available, by appointment only, every Tuesday afternoon from February 5th through April 9th at the City of Miami Springs Senior Center, located at 343 Payne Drive on Prince Field: Electronic filing will be available on the premises.

Most taxpayers have a choice of taking either a standard deduction or itemizing their deductions. If you have a substantial amount of deductions, you may want to itemize. You will need to bring the following information:

interest Receipts or canceled checks for med-

- ical/dental expenses (including doctor and hospital bills and medical insurance premiums), receipts for prescription medicines, costs of assisted living services and bills for home improvements, such as ramps and rail-ings for people with disabilities.
- Receipts for contributions to charity
- · Receipts or canceled checks for all tax income and property taxes you paid, as well as records of tax refunds

- Dependent care provider information (name, employer ID or Social Security number)
- Receipts, canceled checks or 1099 forms related to continuing education.

THE CITY OF MIAMI SPRINGS SENIOR CENTER, located on Prince Field at 343 Payne Drive, offers a variety of activities and services to older residents age 60 and over. Residential Tips for Protecting **Your Home**

Due to the recent rise in home burglaries

Due to the recent rise in home burglaries the Miami Springs Police Department would like to offer the following tips to help protect your home against burglaries.

Remove or prune bushes that hide widows and doors, thereby eliminating a hiding place for someone trying to break into your home. Plant thomy bushes under windows, they can be for these plant lates away.

they can help to keep intruders away.

• Light the outside entrances, garage Light the outside entrances, garage doors, pathways, stainwells and parking areas. Consider different types of lights, like motion sensor floodlights or photoelectric lights turn on automatically at dusk and off at dusk.

 Put only your first initial and last name. on mailboxes and building directories. If you live alone, list a fictitious roommate.

 Don't leave ladders or tools outside. A livede could use them to brack in.

Don't leave landers or roots outside. A burglar could use them to break in:
 Don't hide house keys anywhere outside. A burglar might find them; instead leave a spare with a trusty neighbor.
 Be sure that outside doors are solid metal or hardwood. Frames and hardware.

must also be strong. Whenever possible, use deadbolt locks.

 Secure sliding glass doors by placing a broomstick or steel rod in the track. You can also drill a hole through the upper part of the slider and track. Then insert a sturdy nail, bolt or screw, be sure you can remove it

easily.

Check windows to make sure your windows close properly and are locked. Inspect windows to be sure they are firmly attached to the window frame

 While you're away from your home for an extended period of time, make your home look occupied. Timers can be used to turn some lights on and off, as well as radios or TV. Turn the telephone ringer down to "low" or "off" so a burglar won't hear the phone ringing and realize no one is home.

Ask a neighbor or family to collect your mail and newspapers daily. Or contact the post office and newspaper to stop delivery

while you're away.

As a Community residents can take steps to help each other prevent becoming a vic-tim. If a car is parked and occupied, if some-one looks out of place, suspicious call the Miami Springs Police Department at 305,888,9711. We will always be happy to respond, it's better to prevent than to

CODE COMPLIANCE CORNER

Remember that you can access all of our City Codes free of charge online at our website. Simply type in http://www.miamisprings-fl.gov in your browser's address window. At the top of the website, you will see a tab on the far right side that says "Online Services." Click on the tab and scroll down to "Online Municipal Code." This will take you to Municode.com, where you will see our entire Code of Ordinances.

FEBRUARY CODE COMPLIANCE

During the month of February we will be continuing to cover the entire City looking for two types of violation. The first will be the proper display of Street Numbers.

Our Code of Ordinances (this section was

updated last year) states the following:

Sec. 96-05. - Display of street numbers.

(A) The street numbers assigned to all structures in the City shall comply with the fol-

lowing requirements: (1) Must be at least three inches in height. (2) Must be in a contrasting color to that of the structure to which it is attached.

(3) Must be visible and easily readable from the roadway fronting the displayed street

(4) No trees, shrubs, or other foliage shall be maintained in such a manner as to obstruct

the visibility of any street number from the roadway fronting the displayed street number. (B) Notwithstanding the foregoing, street numbers may be displayed upon attached or detached mailboxes, so long as the location and placement of the street numbers on the

mailboxes is in compliance with the requirements of the preceding section.

(C) All street numbers which are currently

readable and visible from the roadwa fronting the displayed street number shall have two years to comply with all the require ments of subsection (A) of this section.

(D) All street numbers which are not currently easily readable and visible from the roadway fronting the displayed street number are required to immediately comply with the requirements of subsection (A) of this section. (1962 Code, § 19-5; Ord. 247, passed 4-

25-60; amend. Ord. 1028-2011, passed 11-

PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT YOUR STREET NUMBER IS PROPERLY DIS-PLAYED. THIS COULD BE VITALLY IMPORTANT TO YOU IF EMERGENCY SERVICES (POLICE OR FIRE/RESCUE) ARE TRYING TO LOCATE YOUR HOUSE! THANKS FOR YOUR COOPERATION.

The second sweep will be for illegal parking of Recreational vehicles. Remember that per the Code, Recreational vehicles can only be parked in completely enclosed structures, or in rear yards. Side yard parking is illegal without a variance and front yard parking is never allowed.


