## MSPD unveils new Bicycle Unit

Miami Springs Police Department launches a bicycle unit to better serve the community.

"Years ago Miami Springs Police Department had a bike unit and I wanted to bring it back. We got some new officers that we selected to go to the training and they're in good shape"- Chief Armando Guzman.

The goal of this new bicycle unit is to go out there and make contact with the community and address things that are easier to do on a bicycle. The chief expresses the fact that there are a lot of things that can be approached on a bicycle versus a vehicle. For example, if someone is up to something, they may not even notice the officer on the bike approaching the scene.

Officer Lazaro Rodriguez shares his commitment to the bicycle unit by saying "we are going to try and touch base with business owners and residents to let them know that we are here protecting the city. We are also going to be

patrolling areas looking for anything suspicious and really just being visible."

The mountain bikes that were chosen for the MSPD bicycle unit were built to withstand various types of terrain, making it easier for police officers to go navigate through alleyways and the city's swales.

You can anticipate to see this new bicycle unit a few times a month. The unit is divided into two-3 man teams covering the east side and west side of the city and working their way to the center of the city as the day progresses.

Message from the unit: We definitely encourage the community to come and ask us questions - this bike patrol gives us a better feel for a one-on-one that we usually don't have when we are on cars. "If you see something, say something."

**Promoting safe and responsible use of consumer fireworks**

The Miami Springs Police Department offer these safety tips to ensure your holiday is safe.

- Obey all local laws regarding the use of fireworks.
- Know your fireworks; read the cautionary labels and performance descriptions before igniting.
- A responsible adult SHOULD supervise all firework activities. Never give fireworks to children.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Save your alcohol for after the show.
- Wear safety glasses when shooting fireworks.
- Light one firework at a time and then quickly move away.
- Use fireworks OUTDOORS in a clear area; away from buildings and vehicles.
- Never relight a "dud" firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.
- Always have a bucket of water and charged water hose nearby.
- Never carry fireworks in your POCKET or

shoot them into METAL or GLASS containers.

- Do not experiment with homemade fireworks.
- Dispose of spent fireworks by wetting them down and place in a metal trash can away from any building or combustible materials until the next day.
- FAA regulations PROHIBIT the possession and transportation of fireworks in your checked baggage or carry-on luggage.
- Report illegal explosives, like M-80s and quarter sticks, to the fire or police department. And let's not forget the safety of our pets!
- Don't bring your pets to a fireworks display, even a small one.
- If fireworks are being used near your home, put your pet in a safe, interior room to avoid exposure to the sound.
- Make sure your pet has an identification tag, in case it runs off during a fireworks display.
- Never shoot fireworks of any kind (consumer fireworks, sparklers, fountains, etc.) near pets.

**Summer Reminders**

Summer is here! Even though we have summer like weather year round in South Florida, now schools out and our children are outdoors playing and enjoying our beautiful City.

As always, our mission is assist you in complying with city code violations that could cause unsafe situations in our streets, sidewalks and swale areas.

However, it is impossible to keep our City free of obstructions on the rights-of-way, without the cooperation of our residents and visitors. It is unlawful to block sidewalks, view of oncoming traffic and place non-permanent items on the swale area that could either fall or cause a safety hazard to pedestrians and traffic.

Please take a few moments to read our City Ordinances regarding obstruction of right-of-ways, view of traffic and blocking of sidewalks.

**Sec. 96-07. - Maintenance of City parkway and swale areas.**

(A) The City shall retain sole jurisdiction over and maintenance responsibility for, all parkway areas in the City.

(B) It shall be the duty and obligation of all owners of property in the City to maintain

all swale areas abutting, adjacent, or contiguous to their property in a good and proper condition. This maintenance duty and obligation for property owners shall include, but not be limited to, sodding, grass cutting, proper landscape maintenance, removal of debris, garbage, or trash, and the elimination of any dangerous conditions or safety hazards in all swale areas.

**Sec. 71-02. - Obstruction of roads.**  
 It shall be unlawful to obstruct any public road or established highway without permission of the proper authorities, or to willfully cause any obstruction to be placed therein, and each day the obstruction is allowed to remain in any highway after being so placed, shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.  
 (Code 1962, § 16-31; Ord. 84, passed 3-10-47)

**Cross reference—** Penalty, § 10-99.

**Sec. 71-03. - Shrubbery obstructing view of vehicle operator.**

It shall be unlawful for any person to maintain or permit shrubbery or any growth to grow upon any parcel of land at the intersection of any highways in the City, so that it will obstruct the view of the driver or operator of any vehicle approaching such intersection from another highway.

(Code 1962, § 16-32; Ord. 84, passed 3-10-47)

**Water Restrictions**

- Watering is not allowed between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
  - Hand-watering with one hose fitted with an automatic shut-off nozzle is allowed for 10 minutes per day for landscape stress relief and to prevent plant die-off.
  - Restrictions apply to all users of any water resource within Miami-Dade County, whether from publicly or privately-owned water utility sewer systems, private wells or private connections to surface water bodies. Residents and businesses with an ODD-numbered street address (ending in 1, 3, 5, 7, 9):
    - Lawn watering is permitted on WEDNESDAYS and SATURDAYS from 4 p.m. to 10 a.m.
  - Residents and businesses with an EVEN-numbered street address (ending in 0, 2, 4, 6, 8\*), no street address, or who water both even and odd addresses within the same zones, including multi-family units and Homeowner Associations:
    - Lawn watering is permitted on THURSDAYS and SUNDAYS from 4 p.m. to 10 a.m.
- Residents should choose from one of two

"watering windows" (before 10 a.m. or after 4 p.m.) on their designated irrigation days. For the most efficient use of water, residents should avoid irrigating during both time periods on the same day.

To report a water restriction violation, visit the 3-1-1 submit a service request website and select Other under the All tab or call 3-1-1.

**Some exceptions**

Restrictions don't apply for car and boat washing, pressure cleaning of paved surfaces, decorative fountains and water-based recreation (e.g. swimming pools, water slides).

Users of 100 percent reclaimed water are exempt from restrictions, but encouraged to conserve water.

Low-volume irrigation, including the use of drop and micro jet systems that apply water directly to plant root zones, is not restricted but is encouraged to be reduced.

Newly-planted gardens and landscaping New landscaping can be watered during the corresponding hours listed above every day, except Fridays, for the first 90 days it is installed. Save the receipt with the date of purchase. When unable to water during specific hours, call 3-1-1 to apply for a variance

The Miami Springs Senior Center offers a variety of FREE activities and services to older residents of Miami Springs and Virginia Gardens, age 60 and over. Current financial and programmatic support comes from: the City of Miami Springs, the Alliance for Aging, Inc., the Florida Department of Elder Affairs, the Village of Virginia Gardens, participant donations, local business organizations, civic groups and countless volunteers.

### CONGREGATE MEALS:

Hot lunch meals are served weekdays from 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. to assist area seniors in maintaining a nutritionally balanced diet and to provide opportunities to volunteer and socialize with their peers.

### TRANSPORTATION:

Daily pick up, utilizing the Hialeah-MS Rotary Charitable Foundation bus, is provided to older residents with no means of transportation to and from the center.

- Weekly trips to grocery stores, assistance with shopping and carrying packages is provided.

- Field trips to malls and other places of interest are scheduled each month.

- Trips currently scheduled for July: Walmart (7/5), Publix (7/13). Fresco y Mas (7/20) and , Sabor (7/26).

### RECREATION ACTIVITIES:

Recreational and social events are planned each month at the senior center. The following activities are currently planned for July: participation in the Independence Day Parade (7/4); celebration of July birthdays and anniversaries (7/18); weekly Bingo games (7/2, 7/9, 7/16, 7/23 and 7/30); and shopping trips to Walmart, Publix, Fresco y Mas and Sabor.
