Administrators and educators in our community have embarked in a new school year filled with enriching lesson plans and fun-filled activities to engage students and entice them to collaborate with their peers. City Hall leaders are similarly striving to ramp-up community involvement through appealing events. Spearheading this effort is the Professional Services team, which is composed of Assistant City Manager Tammy Romero, and Professional Services Specialists Tammy Key (specializing in grants and City projects) and Ana Hume

School is Open - Drive Carefully

It's that time of year again when parents and children across the country are preparing to go back to school. As part of our commitment to all the Miami Springs Police Department would like to help you with your preparations by offering these simple safety

School Zone **Driving Safety Tips**

- Be on the lookout for school zone signals, be sure to slow down and AL-WAYS obey the speed limits.
- Always come to a complete stop, checking carefully for children on sidewalks and in crosswalks before proceed-
- Always stop for school busses that are loading or unloading children.
- Watch out for school crossing guards and obey their signals.
- Be aware of and watch out for children near schools, bus stops, sidewalks, in the streets, in school parking lots,
- Every vehicle has blind spots. Check for children on the sidewalk, in the driveway and around your vehicle before slowly backing up. Teach your children to never play in, under or around vehicles.
- Never pass other vehicles, change lanes or make U-Turns while driving in a school zone.
- Never text or use a cell phone, unless it is completely hands-free, while driving in a school zone.

Riding Your Bike to School

- Children on bikes are often inexperienced, unsteady and unpredictable. Slow down and allow at least three feet of passing distance between your vehicle and a bicyclist.
 - Make sure your child always wears a bicycle helmet!



- In the event of an accident, helmets reduce the risk of head injury by as much as 85 percent.
- Obey the rules of the road; the rules are the same for all vehicles, in-
- Always stay on the right-hand side of the road and ride in the same direction as traffic.
- Be sure your child know and uses all of the appropriate hand signals.
- If possible, try to ride with someone else. There is safety in numbers.

Walking to School

- Leave early enough to arrive at school at least 10 minutes prior to the start of school.
- Use the same route every day and never use shortcuts.
- Always use public sidewalks and streets when walking
- Demonstrate traffic safety awareness and pick the safest route between your home and the school
- Try and walk to school with other students. There is strength in numbers.
- Only cross streets at designated crosswalks, street corners and traffic controlled intersections.
- Always look both ways before crossing the street and never enter streets from between obstacles like parked cars, shrubbery, signs, etc.
 - Always walk and never run across intersections.
- Avoid talking to strangers. Teach your children to get distance between themselves and anyone who tries to approach or make contact with them.
- If a stranger does approach your child, make sure they know to immediately report the incident to you or a
- Teach your children to never get into a vehicle with anyone, even if they know them, without your permission.

ARE YOU MISSING YOUR NUMBERS?

We are asking home owners and business owners to check their properties to make sure that the address number is visible from the street. The Code Compliance Department has received various complaints from the Police Department, Building Inspectors, and Postal Service personnel stating that

they are having difficulties finding the correct addresses. If your house or building has been painted, remodeled, or the vegetation has overgrown, causing for the property numbers to be missing or obstructed, please replace/fix them so that they are visible from the street.

Emergency personnel has to be able to locate homes/businesses as quickly as possible to avoid further complications to services being rendered. We suggest that you take a moment to review the Florida Building Code and our City Municipal Code.

FBC SECTION R319 SITE ADDRESS

R319.1 Address numbers. Buildings shall have approved address numbers, building numbers or approved building identification placed in a position that is plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property. These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numbers or alphabetical letters. Numbers shall be minimum 4 inches (102 mm) high with a minimum stroke width of $\frac{1}{2}$ inch (12.7mm). Where access is by means of a private road and the building address cannot be or viewed from the public way, a monument, pole or other sign or means shall be used to identify the structure. **CITY OF MIAMI SPRINGS** MUNICIPAL CODE

Sec. 96-05. - Display of street numbers.

(A) The street numbers assigned to all structures in the City shall comply with the following requirements:

- (1) Must be at least three (3) inches in height.
 - (2) Must be in a contrasting color to that of the structure to which it is attached.
- (3) Must be visible and easily readable from the roadway fronting the displayed street number.

(4) No trees, shrubs, or other foliage shall be maintained in such a manner as to obstruct the visibility of any street number from the roadway fronting the displayed street number.

(B) Notwithstanding the foregoing, street numbers may be displayed upon attached or detached mailboxes, so long as the location and placement of the street numbers on the mailboxes is in compliance with the requirements of the preceding section.

(C) All street numbers which are currently easily readable and visible from the roadway fronting the displayed street number shall have two years to comply with all the reguirements of subsection (A) of this section.

(D) All street numbers which are not currently easily readable and visible from the roadway fronting the displayed street number are required to immediately comply with the requirements of subsection (A) of this section.



Aeration of the Golf Course allows the relief of soil compaction, stimulates root growth, and improves drainage. Furthermore, aeration holes filled with sand topdressing, will allow excess water from the soil to evaporate, promote root development and improve drainage.


