According to Care2.com, here are some reasons a bike path is benefiting for a City:

1. It inspires more people to ride bicycles: New Orleans saw a 57% increase in cyclists within 6 months after bike lanes were marked. Los Angeles saw a 52% jump in cyclists, and New York City found it was able to double the number of people commuting by bicycle.

2. It stimulates the local economy: In Manhattan, streets that had bike lanes, saw their business increase by

nearly 50% (this can also be attributed to a number of additional factors)

3. It's safer for cyclists: Research shows city streets with bike lanes reduce the rate of cyclist injury by 50%.

4. It's safer for motorists: Occasionally, motorists will get too close to bikers on the street and cause accidents that way, but having a bike lane within a median, should dramatically decrease motorist accidents involving a cyclist.

5. It has a real impact on the environment: This lessens the number of vehicles on the road, therefore minimizing pollution and burning of fossil fuels.

There's excitement in the air as the holidays draw near and we begin to decorate our homes. Here are a few pointers to keep in mind when decorating the exterior of your property:


• Please keep safety a priority on your property for pedestrians and your visitors.

• It is very important that the house number is always visible from the street, if your house doesn't have one, replace it as soon as possible.

In order to make sure our City is safe, we will be monitoring the right of ways such as sidewalks, swales and trees for potential hazards, during the Holidays. Minor infractions will not be cited, however if we see decorations that could be a hazard, you will be asked to remove it.

The Miami Springs Police Department would like to offer some holiday shopping safety tips.

Tip #1

Avoid shopping alone. Instead, take a family member or friend.

Tip #2

Dress casually and comfortably. Avoid wearing expensive jewelry.

Tip #3

Remember to lock your vehicle. Don't leave items visible in your vehicle. Put them in the trunk or underneath the seats where they are out of sight. If possible, take your bags directly home instead of leaving them in the car.

Tip #4

Carry minimal cash. Instead, use checks or debit/credit cards to make purchases. (Notify the credit card issuer immediately if your credit card is lost, stolen or misused. Keep a record of all of your credit cards numbers in a safe place at home)

Tip #5

If you are shopping with children, make a plan in case you get separated. Select a central meeting place and make sure they know they can ask mall personnel or store security employees if they need help. It is best to leave small children at home.

Tip #6

Do not leave your purse or wallet unattended for any amount of time, especially in the shopping cart or at the cashier counter.

Tip #7

Be extra cautious when using ATM's. Use machines located in highly populated areas and be aware of your surroundings.

Tip #8

Avoid overloading yourself with packages. Instead, make frequent trips to your vehicle to lesson your load.

Tip #9

When shopping during evening hours, park your vehicle in well-lit areas.

Tip #10

Beware of strangers approaching you for any reason. At this time of year, "conartists" may try various methods of distracting you with the intention of taking your money or belongings.

If you see any suspicious activity, notify the police, security or appropriate store personnel.
