Identity Theft Prevention Checklist

Identity theft affects millions of Americans each year. You don't want to be one of them. The Miami Springs Police Department is offering some suggestions of what you can do to safeguard your personal information.

Protect your Social Security number and card. Never carry your Social Security card in your wallet or put your number on your checks. Disclose it only when absolutely necessary, using other types of ID whenever possible. If your current driver's license includes your Social Security number, ask to substitute another number. The same goes for your health insurance policy.

Buy a shredder. Some identity thieves go Dumpster-diving to retrieve personal information. Always tear up receipts, old credit card statements, and other personal documents; running them through a shredder is even better. Deposit all outgoing mail in secure mailboxes, preferably at a post office.

Set up secure locations for personal information. At home, have a safe or a lockable file cabinet in which you can store sensitive material. While you're at work, store your purse or wallet in a desk drawer or a cabinet. One with a lock is best.

Get fraud alert. Most credit card companies offer fraud protection, some for free and others for a slight fee. These programs alert you when there are any abnormal purchases or activity on your account.

Consider a credit freeze. A credit freeze prevents credit card companies and other third parties from viewing your credit report. It gives you a little more protection than a fraud alert, but also a little less leeway: You'll need to lift the freeze if you want to apply for a loan or a credit card.

Create intricate passwords. Passwords that include the last four digits of your Social Security number, your graduation date, or your maiden name may be easy to memorize, but they're also easy to crack. Use a mix of letters, numbers, and special characters to create a fool-proof password, and alter it for every online account you have.

Make them clever too. Come up with a phrase and use the first letter of each word, a special character and a number as your password. For example: "I graduated from Miami Springs Senior High School number 1." Password: "igfmsshs#1." And for each Web site, change the number or a character, or



add letters corresponding to the particular website. So when you visit, say, target.com, your password would be "taigfmsshs#1." It may bring a smile to your face to use FluffytheCat as a password, but you won't be smiling when it's been cracked faster than you can type it. Pets' names, car names, last names followed by 1, anything Trekkie, and the word password are particularly vulnerable. Good passwords are a minimum of eight characters and contain numbers, symbols, or punctuation. To make yours easy to remember, "don't use a pass word?use a pass phrase. Then replace some of the vowels with symbols: M@ryh@d@littlel@mb is good; 1'm@p00rm@n is better. What is best? Passwords with letters and symbols that require you to use the "alt" key. As for now, those make a password 99 percent uncrackable.

Set up a PayPal account. If you're an avid online shopper, register your information with this secure third-party service and you won't need to disclose it to other sites. Accepted by most of the biggest online retailers, such as barnesandnoble.com and overstock.com, PayPal also offers around-the-clock fraud monitoring.

Don't go mobile. It may be easy and convenient as far as paying bills go, but it isn't safe. Save yourself the headache and make sure you use a secure site online using your own personal Wi-Fi network to pay your bills.

Think about insurance. Although identity theft insurance does not decrease the risk of theft, it may be a good option for you. An insurance policy can provide some assistance in the identity rebuilding process.

Public Works Department Wages War on Exotic Species

Our Public Works Department has begun a major removal campaign against an invasion of "exotic" (non-native) species along the Miami River Canal bank between the bike path and the waterline. This is part of the City's longterm commitment to invasive plant management. The ongoing effort may result in some gaps in the lush foliage along North Royal Poinciana Boulevard, but City Arborist and Public Works Director Tom Nash wants to assure community members that these are temporary and necessary to allow our native plantings to flourish. including Buttonwood, Gumbo Limbo, West Indies Mahogany, Cocoplum and Firebush.

These lovely plantings are being overrun and strangled by a dense blanket of air potato vines and other aggressive invaders. Some of them grow as much as a foot a day during the rainy season, blocking the sunlight for the ground cover and smaller native plants that grow beneath them. They include vines, lianas and plants that have been named Florida's most invasive plant species by the Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council. These unwelcome exotics have also been identified by The Nature Conservancy as "globally invasive species" and are listed on the Florida Noxious Weed List by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, which recommends their removal from all public and private properties.
